Future Looks Bright for Kelly Graduates

On Feb. 7th students in Mr. Oswald's Chicago History class at Thomas Kelly High School were invited downtown to hear opening arguments in an Illinois Appellate Court case. The Kelly students were invited to the trial by Justice Jesse G. Reyes, a Kelly graduate and the first Latino ever elected to the Illinois Appellate Court.

After graduating from Kelly High School, Justice Reyes attended the University of Illinois at Chicago, and then earned his Juris Doctor degree from the John Marshall Law School. He has been a member of the judiciary since December, 1997, serving both as an associate and elected judge of the Circuit Court of Cook County and was elected to the Appellate Court in November 2012.

Justice Reyes continues to visit and support Kelly High School in a variety of ways. In fact, a recent graduate of Kelly is following in Justice Reyes footsteps. Betty Murcia, a Kelly graduate of 2010 went on to graduate from Loyola University in 2014 and is now in her final months of law school at the De Paul University College of Law.

Ms. Murcia met Justice Reyes several years ago as a student at Kelly while participating in the Mock Trial competition and joined the Kelly students on the field trip to hear the case Justice Reyes' was presiding over.

More recently, Ms. Murcia worked with the Cook County State's Attorney Office where she researched case law and legal issues and checked the backgrounds of defendants prior to trials. While a student at Kelly, Betty was a student in Mr. Halberg's Law class. Mr. Halberg also sponsors the Mock Trial program at Kelly and oversees the Mikva Challenge, a program that encourages high school students to be active participants in the political process.

Not only did Kelly students get to see an Appellate Court case on their field trip, but Justice Reyes spent a lot of time with the students afterwards showing them around the courtroom and talking to them about different aspects of his job and the legal system in general.

Justice Reyes and Ms. Murcia then accompanied the students to lunch where they shared their experiences as former students at Kelly as well as their experiences after high school on their road to college, law school, and becoming a judge.

The students were grateful for this opportunity as they learned a lot about what it takes to be a lawyer. The students were also inspired by Justice Reyes and Betty Murcia's success and words of encouragement as they prove the future looks bright for anyone who applies themselves, as so many students at Kelly continue to do every day.

Kelly High School is gradually becoming a hub for aspiring mathematicians, as they are currently placed fourth in the city in Division B of the City of Chicago Mathematics League, a year-long series of five math competitions. Kelly competes against such reputable schools as Jones College Prep, Lindblom College Prep, Lane Tech, Curie, and Von Steuben. Additionally, Kelly has placed higher than any other CPS neighborhood school in this competition for the last several years and is showing no signs of slowing down.

Kelly High School's math team is one of the many clubs, organizations, and academic and athletic teams that Kelly offers its students....and all kinds of kids participate! Freshmen Nasario Uriostegui and Analydia Valdivia both agree that being on the math team is not intimidating! "Our coach, Mr. C. encourages us to do our best. He takes care of us-hypes us up! He has a lot of enthusiasm about math and then we get excited and confident too." Mr. Serge Cvetkovic, aka "Mr. C.," talks proudly about the Kelly team this year. "We are leading any neighborhood school in the city and are highly competitive with some of the selective enrollment schools. We have a great group of freshmen; so by the time they are juniors and seniors they will be valuable assets to the team." He describes the Chicago Public School Math League and Kelly's math team as a "hidden gem".

"When our kids joined, I have to admit, they were a bit leery, but four competitions later, they are still on the team and have gained confidence and ability." Being on the math team builds confidence and prepares students for college.

Coach Cvetkovic says that the math team "gets students ready for college because math competitions generally have problems that are not taught in a traditional math class, and this forces kids to work outside the box solving problems that require higher order thinking skills." Kelly math team freshmen members Uriostegui and Valdivia explain that the team presents "many different problems and solutions and we figure out how to solve them. They are higher order problems we won't see in class, but we do see in competitions. They get us ready for life outside of school for college and more difficult math."

Math team practice consists of lot of different types of problems. Freshmen do Algebra problems, sophomores do Geometry problems, and juniors and seniors do Algebra 2 and pre-calculus problems, respectively. The coaches go over the problems, solutions, and explanations and then the mathletes practice. "It's interesting! We learn new things and you don't definitely don't have to be the best at math," states Valdivia. Coach Cvetkovic adds that students "really just need a curiosity and a love for math," adds Mr. Cvetkovic.

By far, the students' favorite part of the competition is when the team proceeds to the candy bar round. This a final round and is named simply for its prize: a candy bar. "It's a badge of honor to have scored enough points to stay as a team and compete,"

The Wrigley Property

The Sun-Times recently had interesting articles about the old Wrigley Building on 35th and Ashland. It talked about the huge sums of money being tossed around. Many of my neighbors have talked to me about the property and the two things most mentioned were: That's not Bridgeport, and will we ever know what's happening before it's too late.

First the property was and still is in McKinley Park. Any official list of neighborhoods shows the boundary on the east of McKinley Park is "Bubbly Creek". These maps include those from the Army Corps of Engineers, several city departments and that put out by the Chicago Police Department. The fun fact is McKinley Park is one of the lowest crime rates in the city and many of the crimes come from shop lifting at the Mariano's. These crimes are always listed against McKinley Park, even though Mariano's claims to be in Bridgeport. I worked for a mirror factory, which

was just east of the working Wrigley building at that time. Some of their stationary said McKinley Park, Chicago, Illinois.

Spending my teen years in Bridgeport, we were always disgusted when the papers blamed Bridgeport for everything that occurred in Armour Square or Canaryville. The headlines of Bridgeport like today just wants to associate non-tasteful activities with clout and the mayors. It is true the Wrigley Building has always been in the 11th Ward, but with the last census with many new homes on old railroad property and new homes built around former factories around Donovan Park has forced moving the western end of the Ward to be placed in the 12th.

The Wrigley property has no registered voters and with many deals already started with the 11th Ward it makes sense not to redesignate the location. In fact, according to the website the company that purchased the property has already purchased more property in the 3800 block of South Ashland.

The people who mentioned the article to me may not be connected, but are good hard-working intelligent people, many of which had relatives that worked for Wrigley and walked home. What they do worry about is the 11th Ward may not consider those most impacted by what happens on the property because they cannot vote in the 11th Ward. The property has no neighbors east or south and the only neighbors they do have to the west and north are within the 12th Ward and, yes, they are McKinley Park residents.

The facts are we lost a lot more than tax money when Wrigley left the neighborhood. That is most notable when the people fondly remember that in the busy days of the Stock Yards it was great to smell the juicy fruit and doublemint along with the old Holsum Bakery that replaced the alternative aroma from the south-east.



With spring in full swing, it is an APEtastic time to venture to Brookfield Zoo's Tropic World on Saturday, April 8, from 10:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and Sunday, April 9, from 10:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. That's when the annual Ape Awareness Weekend celebration highlights the zoo's three ape species: western lowland gorillas, orangutans, and white-cheeked gibbons.

Throughout the weekend, guests can participate in interactive, ape-related activities such as comparing their own weight, arm length, and hand size with those of an orangutan and gorilla or building apeline nests using paper and wheelbarrows. The exhibit will be full of visuals, including the types of food apes eat and items that are used for training the animals to participate in their own health care.

Zoogoers can also attend special Zoo Chats throughout Tropic World to learn more about ape

populations: Orangutans at noon in the Asia section; White-cheeked gibbons at 1:00 p.m. in the Asia section; A conservation overview at 2:00 p.m. in the South America section and Western lowland gorillas at 2:45 p.m. in the Africa section.

Zoogoers can help gorillas by donating cell phones, cell phone accessories, papers, handheld games, e-readers, and laptops. Coltan—a metallic ore used in the manufacturing of these products—is primarily mined in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. The greater the demand for these electronics, the greater the demand for coltan, which sadly results in the destruction of gorilla habitats. Guests can drop them at the zoo's recycling stations, which will be located at the North and South Gates.

Assistance For Reverse Mortgage
The Illinois Housing Development Authority launched the Reverse Mortgage Assistance Program to help senior homeowners with up to \$35,000 in federal assistance to qualifying borrowers to pay overdue property taxes, eligible property expenses and future property taxes so they can avoid foreclosure and remain in their homes.
Reverse Mortgages allow homeowners 62 and older to borrow against the equity they have built up in their home. The proceeds the borrower receives from the reverse mortgage must be repaid when the house is sold or the homeowners move. The borrower is still responsible for paying property taxes and homeowner's insurance, and if they are unable to keep up with their payments, they may lose the home to foreclosure.
The homeowner must live in the property as their primary residence and have a household income lower than 120 percent of their county's median income, or \$73,920 for a household of two in Cook County.
