

2024 will begin with a new neighborhood group and you're invited to help us get started. If you like sewing garments, then this new group is just for you with a slight twist: We'll be sewing men and women's casual wear, coats & jackets, and a touch of vintage sewing.

The new neighborhood group will meet the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of every month at Raley's One Market, 3935 Park Drive, El Dorado Hills. Our meeting time is10-3.

For our first meeting bring your sewing machine and ideas - a free fabric kit will be provided for you to learn a new surprise technique.

I would like to hear from anyone who has suggestions or questions because now is the best time to get your ideas included. You do not need to have advanced sewing skills because we're going to teach you the techniques you need while you make garments.

#### Reno's NG Invitation to Sew

Come join us for a sewing retreat in the mountains and a fantastic view of Lake Tahoe! Our annual Camp Sew & Sew is scheduled for Sun, March 24, through Friday, March 29, 2024. As we have for several years, we are holding this at the Zephyr Point Conference Center and we'll be using the Inspiration Point conference room (again) and rooms at the Tallac Center. The sewing area will be set up for up to 24 participants with ironing and cutting stations in the room or nearby. Food is provided by the Center and our rooms have 2 (or 3) queen size beds with its own bathroom.

While it seems like a lot of effort to schlep your gear to Lake Tahoe, the benefits are many! Lots of good cheer, bragging rights abound, oohs and aahs as your projects progress during the week, and no interruptions except to socialize. Once set up, you are free to work when you want, and for however long you want! Best of all is no food prep - it's supplied by the Center! We have a coffee bar outside of the workroom, and someone is always up early to get the coffee started. Many bring munchies to go along with that coffee, tea, or whatever (I suggest you wrap them separately if they are handmade).

The price is \$600 or \$950 for double or single occupancy per room - our fees just cover our expenses - so we really NEED to have 21-24 attendees to clear that hurdle. Fill out your registration form and remit with payment as soon as you can commit (Gold Country ASG members can delay payment until Mar 10 but should provide a registration form early to get their "spot"). We must have a headcount by March 10, 2024. There is a late fee added to applications sent after Feb 1, 2024. We are limiting our numbers to 24 so that we have maximum workspace per attendee.

#### NOTES:

- The sewing workroom is open/available from 4pm Sunday until noon on Friday.
- Also, there is no large parking area near our rooms/workroom, so you will have to drive down, drop off your sewing and personal items at the workroom, pick up your keys and settle into your room, then park back by the main lodge (and parking garage).
- Bedrooms will be in the Tallac Center on the first floor and the workroom access is from the first floor, middle of the building. Entrance at the middle of the building is on the 2nd floor; there is an elevator.
- No alcohol is allowed in public areas (cafeteria or sewing workroom).

ROOMS: All rooms have 2 queen size beds and a private bath. There are a limited number of 3-bed rooms.

#### LOOKING FOR GOLD COUNTRY CHAPTER STORAGE

We have been notified that the cost of our current storage is more than quadrupling as of March, 2024! We have been paying \$24 (below market rate) for our 10' x 10' for many years but soon the rate will be \$100/month. Now we must consider other options for our Placerville Sew Threads of Love Community Service Group and our chapter documentation storage.

Does anyone have any recommendations for other storage facilities that might not be so costly (10 x 10 unit)? Or would a member consider having us use some available space on their property such as a garage or storage shed?

We've been using the generous donation of an unused section of a 2-car garage space for Community Service fabric and equipment in Jackson for the Sew Threads of Love Too group. This has been very much appreciated!

If you can think of alternative ideas, we would love to hear them! Let's save our chapter's funds for the FUN stuff! Thank you.

#### **GOT TOUGH SEWING PROJECTS?**

If you need to sew through dense materials such as leather, multiple layers of canvas or Sunbrella brand acrylic outdoor fabric, you know that you need a big, powerful motor in an industrial sewing machine. But for small repairs, or attaching leather straps to fabric totes there is a neat little hand tool for these jobs. The "Speedy Stitcher sewing awl" has been around for over a century. I was introduced to it when I lived aboard my sailboat and was trying to repair the thick binding on our main sail in the hot sun at anchor. A friendly boater nearby rowed over and suggested I use his sewing awl (he must have heard me grunting and fussing). Anyway, it worked beautifully! The stitch that it creates is the same as that of the sewing machine: you make a loop from top to bottom, thread the other end of the waxed thread through the loop and pull the loop back up. The hard part is getting that point where the loop and bottom thread connect hidden in the seam.

#### Sew Timeless with Kandi L. Blackwell January 24, 2024

If you missed ASG's National Conference this year, you're in luck! Kandi L. Christian-Blackwell will host the workshops she presented in New York earlier this year for our Chapter.

The classes are great fun and teach interesting and useful sewing techniques including special methods and tips for sewing with silk. These full-day hands-on classes are described below and list the class-specific kit fee. Each workshop will be held via Zoom. #### Sewing with Silk – The Queen of Fabrics: The Basics

Working with silk requires special techniques. In the introductory class you'll learn hands-on special skills for recognizing and sewing different kinds of silk that can be used for any future project. You'll practice seam finishes such as Hong Kong; how to prevent puckered seams and learn a tailor's hem that is perfect for silk and more. You'll add your samples into a workbook so you'll be able to easily remember the techniques later.

You'll learn how to sew a Hong Kong seam around a curve, how to cut and sew slippery silks, the perfect French seam and more. You'll add your samples into a workbook so you'll be able to easily remember the techniques later.

#### **Introduction to French Sewing Techniques**

French hand sewing or heirloom sewing, incorporates fine fabric, embroidered insertion, lace, entredeux, puffing and tucked panels creating delicate garments and other items. It's the art of manipulating fabric and often involves making strips that are all sewn together using special techniques to make a piece of fabric. Traditionally, this was done by hand and took hours to complete a garment. You'll use a sewing machine to create the same techniques in a fraction of the time.
