



Curriculum To Meet Your Needs

The Education field has had many part time programs that could enhance your knowledge of the various curriculum available in schools. This includes Pre-K to 12, public, parochial, private, and home schools. I was involved in many of these over the years, mostly in Math. I wrote the Math curriculum for three Catholic high schools, now all closed, sorry about that. I also served on several state accreditation reports which, as a team, we checked to make sure that the curriculum met state requirements (these eight are all still open). I also worked on several state commissions to check the curriculum in other areas of the state and in the country.

I mention these because things have really changed these last 20 years. Those working on secondary curriculum have some great advantages now. While the people I worked with spent many hours compiling data from all the materials all these schools gave us, we did not get extra pay, but if we were in a classroom our school got a sub for us and as an administra-

tor, you got class credit for your own recertification.

Many school boards have full time staff to do this now. Thanks to computers and programs, it is much easier to do a good job. SETDA (State Educational Technology Directors Association) has developed the K-12 Instructional Materials Dashboard. This program contains a data base of 450 print and digital licensed programs so that the curriculum personnel have no need to contact the salesmen for copies. The Dashboard has collected all publicly available information from 12 different states (not Illinois) that have standards and educational goals specifically addressed and are accessible to the students.

The Dashboard can be used to sort data by state, content area, grade level, publisher, and copyright date. Some states are approving material that fits their curriculum to make an "approved" list of materials. Some expect the schools to use only this material. Other states just use it as a guideline with no demands.

The State Instructional Materials Review Association, which includes 20 states and Guam, displays its results for a good curriculum and its materials on its website. The trends in modern education seem to demand items that are PC. Those items can be hard to follow, as things often change. Sometimes words change so often that editors cannot keep up. Being able to reference these accepted materials will help in the choice of materials and make it easier. If you have an issue that comes up, you can always fall back on these organizations and remind them these are accepted nationwide and have been approved by numerous state legislatures.

Cook County TIFS Raise \$1.2 Billion

Tax Increment Financing districts in Cook County will bring in nearly \$1.2 billion for tax year 2018, a 17.4% increase over last year. TIF revenue has increased 27.4% in the City of Chicago and decreased 1/6% in the suburbs compared to last year. The Clerk's full 2018 TIF Revenue Report shows Chicago TIFs will generate approximately \$841 million in tax revenue from its 138 TIFs in the 2018 tax year. This is a \$181 million increase over last year and includes nearly \$116 mil-

lion for the City's "Transit TIF" located on the north side. Last year, Chicago TIF revenue saw an increase of \$99 million. The 303 suburban TIFs are expected to bring in \$339 million, a \$5 million decrease from last year.
