## Blended Learning

Chicago Board of Education is in a real dilemma about teacher training. I will write about this soon after getting more information from principals and students.

But it does lead us to another situation, which is school systems changing programs so often that it does not give programs a chance to prove their worth.

Those parents that have had children in the schools over a number of years and seasoned teachers know what I mean.

School districts seem to be so worried about being passed by their neighboring districts or private schools that they want the newest educational jargon to be associated with them.

The truth is that there are only so many ways to teach and learn and if you are in the educational field long enough, you realize that in essence the programs start to repeat themselves -- oh the jargon changes and the "educanese" trying to impress people but it comes to "done that, did that".

While frustration for principals who must "push the new program to hear". Often they know it's true but they represent the School Board.

Technology in the classroom is expected to become a \$19 billion by 2018. This means that companies can afford great salesmen to push their programs.

Expect a big push from blended learning and other such programs that have come to my attention. It first came on the scene in 2006, but they keep changing the program to upgrade their use of technology.

They use fancy language and use people that are educational consultants, but, in fact, they must sell this program to bureaucrats and not the ones using the programs -- the teachers.

This program, which of course like all programs will work if given the time, effort and financial support that is needed to follow the program completely.

Components of blended learning deal with video lectures, and various forms of digital technology to support the program. They stress mobile



learning capacities, web-enhanced instructions, technology mediated instructions.

The favorite sentence I have seen is Asynchronization -- internet communication technology. These words or ones like them will be in every brochure in every program because these are the catch words that parents and bureaucrats want to claim their school has.

In general, some say blended learning has a student do independent study augmented with digital tools. Others say most is classroom work using a digital platform. Others say all digital work should be done in schools were they have Tech coordinators. So you can see what your school would choose, even though they use the same term might be vastly different. They also show how the high school students can take college classes. Sound new and exciting? We did that in the high school I taught at in 1970.

Looking it up on the internet there are many opinions on what it means. The bottom line seems to be why are you looking for a new program and is the system you are using now a failure? If you decide that a program is needed, make sure it addresses what the teachers and principal say were the shortcomings of the present program. The children deserve programs that are chosen by their potential, not by fancy brochures made to impress parents and bureaucrats.

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## City Council Views Lincoln Artifacts



In recognition of the 150th anniversary of the assassination of President Abraham Lincoln, Chicago History Museum officials displayed rare artifacts from their collection to members of the Chicago City Council. Museum President Registrar Julie Katz is seen holding the bloody sheet on which President Abraham Lincoln died, while museum President Gary Johnson holds the two silver coins that were placed over the deceased President's eyes and a memorial badge worn by mourners. The artifacts were brought to the City Council meeting at the request of 14th Ward Alderman Edward M. Burke, the City Council's unofficial historian. A proclamation was offered by Mayor Rahm Emanuel declaring April 15, 2015, as Abraham Lincoln Day in Chicago "in remembrance of one of the most venerable leaders of the State of Illinois and the United States of America." The 16th President of the United States and the first to be assassinated, was shot at Ford's Theatre on April 14, 1865 and died the following morning.

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

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
