



## Spending Technology Funds Wisely

Technology in our schools is at a stage that money is one of the prime considerations.

I've talked with several principals, teachers and parents about tech in the schools. The common thread is, parents are for all technology and administrators are worried about staying vibrant without spending all the budget in that one area. One school is actively trying to recruit a special type of teacher that can serve as a media coordinator and a librarian.

Kevin Schwartz is the lead technology officer for the Austin, Texas school district. He has written an article that appeared in "Education Week" addressing some situations for those in charge to consider. He cites a barrier to using technology is most effective when there is no "fear of change". Those in charge must convince teachers that change is necessary because the new platform has the potential to truly create better outcomes for students.

Another problem he finds is when a new tool is purchased "simply automates obsolete particular procedures" -- it wastes time. A third problem is low usage of EdTech products. This occurs when it adds to the work-

load yet does not address the wide range of student ability. He suggests that you use tools that work well with the Special Ed students.

He also believes and indicates that professional development that teachers receive is often inadequate. Resistance is high when they do not see a true connection with helping their students. Mr. Schwartz suggests a coaching approach, because it works better with the teachers. The last issue he brings up is that in many cases, the new programs are chosen by staff members who have had little, if any, classroom experience. No one becomes the person in charge of technology that does not find it easy. Therefore, "balance and insight" suggest that those choosing the programs should either be former classroom teachers or have them embedded in the various technology departments.

These are the things that our educators are wise to consider. They must also understand that the total number of students in our schools are dwindling. Socially, families are having fewer kids, more students are being home schooled and many go to school out of the neighborhood to seek special programs. Despite the fact that parochial schools in our area have been drastically reduced, that has been more than made up by numerous charter schools.

Regardless of your political position, schools are not receiving the influx of students as immigrants has slowed down and abortion has not. Taxes are cited in the papers as causing people to leave our area. So principals must be prepared for less students and smaller budgets, much of which will be absorbed by the new contract. Most will consider to do an excellent job of delivering education to our students.

The creation of a dedicated public safety administrative office will help reduce costs, increase efficiency, and improve public safety.

More than 151 sworn officers and 11 uniform fire personnel will be redirected from headquarters back into neighborhoods. CPD's detective areas will be restructured to provide better crime response.

First responders from all three departments will benefit from improved administrative support and additional resources.

Approximately 280 civilian staff from the finance, human resources, information technology, and logistics divisions will be integrated within the new office.

Chicago Public Schools will provide students with a safe place to stay during the day and meals should a work stoppage occur.

Regular classroom instruction will not occur, but school buildings will be open to students. Principals and non-unionized support staff will greet students and ensure they have access to engaging activities.

Charter and contract schools will continue to operate on their normal schedules, and families should look for any updates or changes. After-school activities will be canceled including sports, tutoring, field trips, Parent University activities, Local School Council meetings, and other community activities.

Chicago Public Libraries will be open, along with a limited number of parks, Safe Haven sites, and other
