



**CPS Cuts Budgets**

Many of you have friends, relatives or children attending or working for Chicago Public Schools. A new round of budget cuts has just been completed. The schools and Local School Councils had to deal with cuts from 5% to .08%.

In actual money they range from about \$3200 at the Hamilton School to over \$892,000 at Lane Tech. It is obvious that large schools would lose more money than the smaller ones.

But the whole system makes little sense if you are honest with the people. The CPS budget was passed with expectation of over \$300 million more from the State than the previous year, even though there were no promises and CPS continues to lose students.

Several principals I talked to recently had a common thread in their answers. They believe this is just a political ploy. They believe Chicago has enough money to run the schools.

Recently the Sun-Times had 114 pages listing unpaid property taxes. I personally know CPS employees on the list. Yet there are many law firms out there telling you that they can get your taxes lowered. Some claim by huge amounts and the principals always look back at the TIF program where millions of dollars go into programs not set forth its original intent.

If these funds were sent properly, we wouldn't need a soda tax, a bag tax, new garbage tax, but

the money isn't going to the intended agencies. Look this one up on the internet if you haven't already. You would be shocked.

Most I talked to see that both the kids and teachers are losers. There was no reasonable expectation for the hole in the budget to be filled in Springfield. Several of the principals I know assumed they would have to fill this gap themselves and tried to save funds when the time came.

But in their cuts, CPS took over 40% of unspent Board funds and those trying to protect their schools lost the most. This is why there is such a discrepancy between schools. The Board only took unspent funds.

Research has told us the best way to help kids is lower class size, not special programs or after school programs. How do you take these cuts without laying off people? At some schools, it is impossible. Here are a few of the estimated losses in our area given by DNAINfo: Shields School lost \$63,500; Evergreen Academy lost \$66,700; Brighton Park lost \$72,800; N.Greene lost \$88,800; Burroughs lost \$93,500; Nathan Davis lost \$98,000; Shields Middle School lost \$115,700; and Kelly High lost \$238,000.

Of the principals I talked with, they had this feeling that CPS strictly acts as if we are the only minority district and the poorest district in the state. But neither of these are true. One should consider if you keep sending the same people back to Springfield and expect a different result, something is wrong.

One of the sad outcomes is that many of the schools have parents who are blaming the principals because a favorite teacher has been let go or a favorite program has been cancelled. If you buy a home, and then expect someone else to pay your mortgage, you will eventually lose that house. We, in Chicago, must at least try to pay our own bills.

**Effort To Make Congress Work**



Congressmen Dan Lipinski (IL-3) and Darin LaHood (IL-18) have introduced legislation designed to make Congress work again for the American people. H. Con. Res. 28 would establish a Joint Committee on the Organization of Congress, a powerful legislative tool that Congress effectively employed three times in the 20th century to overcome legislative dysfunction. This bipartisan, bicameral committee would be tasked with analyzing suggestions from congressional experts and the general public, and then making recommendations for reforming congressional procedures so that Congress could more effectively address major issues faced by our nation.

The Joint Committee would be made up of an equal number of Democrats and Republicans, 12 members of the House and 12 members of the Senate, with a specific mandate to make recommendations across the spectrum of needed change in a timely fashion. The Joint Committee would focus on restoring Congress' ability to fulfill its basic responsibilities, including oversight, authorizations, appropriations, legislation, and passing a budget. Specifically, the Joint Committee would first look to overhaul the legislative rules and procedures that internally dictate how Congress operates. Then it would work to empower legislators to take ownership of the legislative process, debate

## Chicago Promotes Home Ownership

Mayor Rahm Emanuel and the Chicago Infrastructure Trust announced the Chicago Home Buyer Assistance Program is accepting applications from families and individuals looking to buy a home in Chicago or refinance an existing mortgage. The program provides support for down payment and closing costs.

"The Home Buyer Assistance Program is another important tool in our tool kit for building stronger neighborhoods throughout the City of Chicago. I am proud that lenders are now accepting applications and I encourage anyone who is interested to apply today," Mayor Emanuel said. "By putting more families on the path to homeownership, we will help more communities thrive."

The program currently has three approved lenders/services now accepting applications: Guaranteed Rate, American Financial Network and Home Trust Mortgage.

First-time home buyers must complete a home buyer education course. Depending on loan type, qualified home buyers can have an annual income limit of up to \$133,000.

Qualified buyers may receive a grant for up to 7 percent of the total loan amount. For example, for a loan amount of \$250,000, a borrower could receive a grant of no more than \$17,500 to

cover down payment and closing costs. Qualified borrowers are required to contribute the lesser of \$1,000 or 1 percent of home purchase price at the closing.

Buyers must occupy the home as their primary residence and reside in the property for at least five years before selling or refinancing. If the home is sold or refinanced before that time, the homeowner will have to pay back a prorated amount of the grant. After five years of on-time mortgage payments, the grant is completely forgiven.

### Promote Reading To Children 0-5

The Chicago Public Library is promoting the importance of reading 20 minutes a day to children ages 0-5.

Research indicates that children are equipped with 100 billion neurons at birth, but pathways between the neurons are not yet established. Reading to children aids in strengthening those connections.

Moreover, the number of words a child is exposed to between the ages of zero and three are strong predictors of educational success and eventual economic stability.

Seminal research shows there is a thirty million word gap between families of lower and higher socioeconomic statuses, so children living in poverty tend to fall behind faster in their development and in school. Children need to hear at least 1,000 stories read aloud before they can learn to read themselves.

Each CPL location will have a reading nook in order to model the practice of reading aloud and to provide an atmosphere conducive to reading aloud.

**Benefit Program For Disabilities**

Illinois State Treasurer Michael Frerichs joined members of the National Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) Alliance, U.S. Senator Richard Burr (R-NC), and advocates of people with disabilities in Washington, D.C. announce a new investment program for people with a disability or blindness that does not jeopardize their federal disability benefits.

The Alliance is part of Illinois and serves as the country's largest multi-state agreement for this investment program that allows for tax-free investment growth when savings are spent on qualifying disability-related expenses.

To qualify for an ABLE account, the account owner must have developed the disability or blindness before the age of 26. A person meeting the age requirement who qualifies for Social Security Administration benefits, or has received a waiver from the IRS, will qualify. Annual contribution limits are tied to the federal gift tax amount, which is \$14,000. The investment can grow up to \$100,000 and not impact eligibility for Social Security Income or other means - tested programs at the federal level. When an ABLE account balance exceeds the \$100,000 cap, Social Security Income benefits are suspended. The benefits resume if the account values fall below \$100,000. ABLE Balances have no implications on Medicaid eligibility.

Investment growth is tax-free at the federal level when used for qualifying purchases, such as medical services, transportation and job training.

## Pulaski Day At Polish Museum



### GENERAL PULASKI

The Polish Museum of America and Polish Roman Catholic Union of America in observance of Casimir Pulaski Day in the Sabina P. Logisz Great Hall, 984 N. Milwaukee ave. on Monday, March 6th at 10 a.m.

Following speeches by public officials and Polonia leaders, the Polish and American patriot will be honored with a wreath laying ceremony at the base of the wall-size oil painting by Stanislaw Batowski (1866-1946). This painting depicts

General Pulaski on horseback in the Battle of Savannah, where he was mortally wounded while fighting for American freedom.

General Kazimierz Pulaski (b. Warsaw, Poland, March 6, 1745 - d. Oct. 9-10, 1779) is recognized as the "Father of the American Cavalry." He offered his services as an experienced military leader to the American Continental Army during the American Revolutionary War. At Brandywine, in 1777, he distinguished himself by leading a daring attack against the British, thereby saving the retreating American Army.

At the insistence of General George Washington, Pulaski was made a Brigadier General and the first Commander of the American Cavalry. He established the Pulaski Legion, a corps of Frenchmen, German Hessians, and Poles, who were instrumental in saving the City of Charleston, South Carolina, from British occupation in 1779. The General's remains were reinterred at Monterrey Square in Savannah, GA in October of 2005. Posthumous honorary US citizenship was granted in 2009.
