A WORD FROM OUR FOUNDER

Over the past 10 years you have traveled with us, you have cried with us and you have loved through us. Action expressed through love is what transforms a life. You have expressed to us the sentiments of your hearts by what you choose to do for the world's poorest children and their families. As I reflect on the thousands of miles traveled from one country to the next seeking out rural and isolated communities with the greatest needs, I always consider the heart and the passion of our committed donors.

Saying thank you has never felt so good as we reflect on our decade of service together. We have impacted the lives of thousands of children and families in now 21 countries around the world. Together we have literally prevented people from dying prematurely, erased illiteracy, and planted possibilities of a greater future.

Our humanitarian work has grown since 2005, reaching over 370,000 people, meeting their immediate needs and providing critical emergency relief. Our volunteers, partners, donors and JAGI's global support teams have made it possible for us as an organization to continue serving children and their families. We are committed to continuing our work within communities until village transformation is apprehended. Our goal is to accomplish continual long-term-development throughout the scope of each project plan.

Nearly a billion people have risen out of poverty in the past 20 years. The original aim under the Millennium Development Goals was to halve global poverty between 1990 and 2015; with your help the goal was met. JAGI's national and global alignments keep up relevant and concentrated on global concerns. Millions of people around the world living in extreme poverty are forced to enter treatment by traditional healers and spear masters because medical clinics/treatment are nonexistent. A recent U.N. report stated, a teenager living in South Sudan is more likely to die in childbirth than to complete school. At least 1.8 billion people globally use a source of drinking water that is fecally contaminated and every day nearly 1,000 children die due to preventable water and sanitation-related diarrheal diseases. The Joseph Assignment is a global partner seeking to eradicate deaths associated with preventable illnesses/diseases and living conditions of thousands of children around the world.

Thank you for your ongoing support as we look forward to the future. With your help, we will continue to work and serve the people we are called to by helping develop countries to ensure all the residents prosper and all the children flourish.

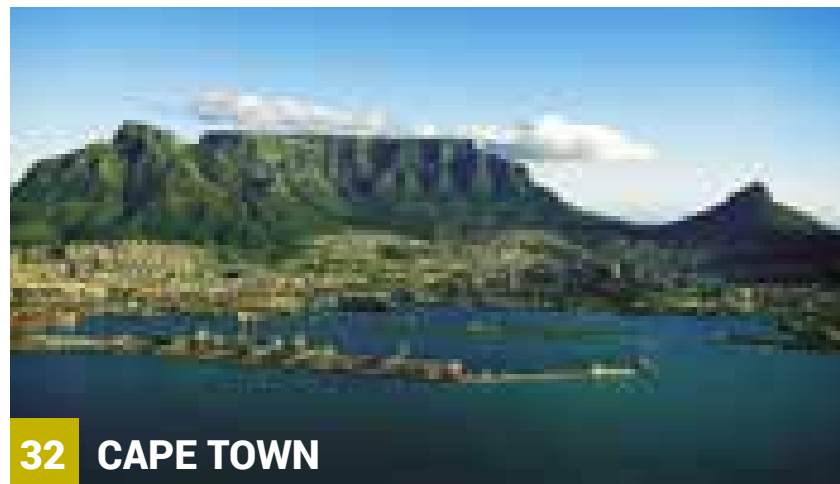

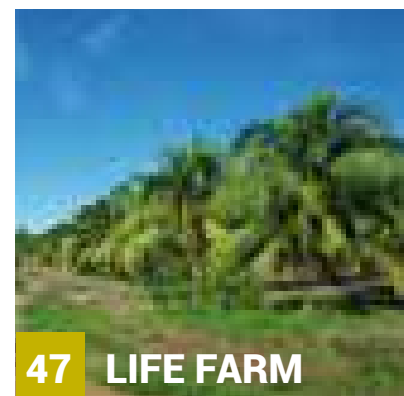

The past 10 years have been incredibly rewarding for me and my husband. Not only have we been able to save thousands of lives through The Joseph Assignment Global Initiative and our global partners, we have also been very instrumental in cultivating an awareness about the plight of those living in extreme poverty. We have not only strived to motivate others to respond to the world's forgotten and their needs financially, but we have also provided a platform for individuals to participate through in-kind donations, through volunteer opportunities, and through private and corporate partnerships. As a result of our mutually concerned partners, The Joseph Assignment has impacted the lives of over 370,000 of the world's poorest children and families' worldwide living in extreme poverty.



I've learned that extreme poverty is multilayered and requires a multilayered holistic approach to eliminate it from communities where it exists, for generations to come. We are both very thankful and proud of the work we've been able to accomplish around the world in the past 10 years.

We have not only worked to bring clean water, housing, emergency relief, food security, economic development, health-care and support to orphanages and to those in need, but we have also been instrumental in connecting adorable children living in poverty to loving parents in the United States through adoption. I am a proponent for families adopting. There is nothing more beautiful than seeing a couple become a loving family, whether through fertility or adoption.

When my husband and I married, we talked about supporting children in countries stricken by poverty. We agreed our first child would be adopted from West Africa. I guess that's another reason why our commitment to Africa is as deep as it is; our children were born there. Eleven years ago our lives changed forever. We met Andrew - a handsome two-year-old little boy at the Bawjiase Orphanage for Children. When Andrew was just two years of age he was found alone and severely malnourished. I remember seeing him at the orphanage when I first arrived and he immediately caught my attention. I was told when he was found, he was immediately taken to the orphanage and had only been there for 3 days before we arrived. He wasn't given a name because he wasn't expected to live; they thought he was going to die. The orphanage didn't have enough food to feed all 127 kids living there, so, we purchased a month's supply and Andrew eventually got stronger and was given the name Kofi Nyame Nahku. Kofi means "born on a Friday", because



they named him on the Friday, and Nyame Nahku, means "God will not let you die". After that day I could not stop thinking about him; it was love at first sight. Though he was the sickest baby there, we felt God was calling us to him. Every day we look at him we are simply honored and privileged that God would bless us to be the parents of such a wonderful baby boy.

Andrew was such a joy to have at home



with us. Do you think we were love struck enough to adopt again? Well, that's exactly what we did. We were first introduced to Nora while conducting one of our medical clinics in the village of Nsaba. Nora was only six years old; she was a child working full time on a cocoa plantation. She was unable to speak English and had never gone to school. At separate times, we both saw a beautiful little girl at the medical clinic. I said to my husband, "I just saw the prettiest little girl," and he replied, "No, I just saw the prettiest little girl." "No, I just saw the prettiest little girl," I replied. It wasn't long before we discovered we were talking about the same pretty little girl. We had our eyes on another beautiful little girl, but she was taken away and we lost contact with her. We wanted Andrew to have someone else from his home country to connect with and relate to, so, Nora became our daughter. We found the other beautiful little girl that we had fallen in love with later as well. She returned to the orphanage so we enrolled her into a boarding school where she has truly grown and excelled as a wonderful young lady and an excellent student. Priscilla is doing outstanding and we are so proud of her. We believe that she will soon come to

America to attend college. We are honored to be Andrew, Nora, and Priscilla's parents. It's been so rewarding watching them grow and become all that God has created them to



be. What we do know is we cannot bring every child home to America. But, if we give them an education and clean water, and provide them with the nourishment they need - they can become all God has called and created them to be. That is what we seek to do for all the other children we touch through The Joseph Assignment Global Initiative. We/You are parents to hundreds and thousands of children throughout the world and again that is our desire for them all. Just because they are born into poverty does not mean they are destined for a life of poverty... is my personal life's motto. Being born into poverty myself, not extreme poverty, but poverty none the less, provided me with an awareness and sensitivity to those living in poverty. What made the greatest impact on me was knowing there were people



there along the way that I didn't know, but who recognized what was in me and they provided the necessary resources and support to ensure my success, if I wanted it. That is what we seek to do in the lives of the children we touch. I believe if we are going to take authority and we're going to take dominion we must do as the Book of Genesis tells us to do, "we must make sure that all hands are on deck. Every child needs to be educated; every child needs to be fed and be given an opportunity to participate in humanity. I believe the cure for some of the world's diseases is in the heart and mind of a hungry child.

I hope that Andrew and Nora will adopt a child(ren) as well. Adoption was always part of our original plan. Our plan was to have children of our own



and adopt our wonderful children. One day we decided our family was complete and focused on helping more children.

The kids that are in India, the kids that are in Riverton City, Jamaica, the kids that are in Africa, the kids that are in China and in Haiti are all just as important to us as Andrew and Nora.

One way we ensure legacy continues to flourish is make sure children around world have food, water and an educa-



tion. I know Andrew and Nora are home with us and we get an opportunity to kiss and hug them every day, yet, I still long for Priscilla and the ones I can't touch physically. So, when a natural disaster happens I'm devastated because I'm thinking about the babies. I see what the mothers, the dads, and the grandparents go through, having nothing, but trying to give their children something. I remember coming out of Haiti after the devastating earthquake reflecting on everything we saw, heard and experienced, and we felt, "God, now they have absolutely nothing." Absolutely nothing is worse than nothing! I share these stories with my children because I want them to be aware of what's really happening in the world and what their responsibility is to

the world and the blessings the Lord has given them.

It's funny watching them argue over who is going to lead The Joseph Assignment. Yes, they are having those types of fights now. "I'm going to be the president," Nora says. "No, I am," says Andrew. "You can run the United Nations," one says. "You can be the president of Ghana". It's comforting to know whatever they become, it will have a global impact and glorify God.

That is the legacy we want to leave.

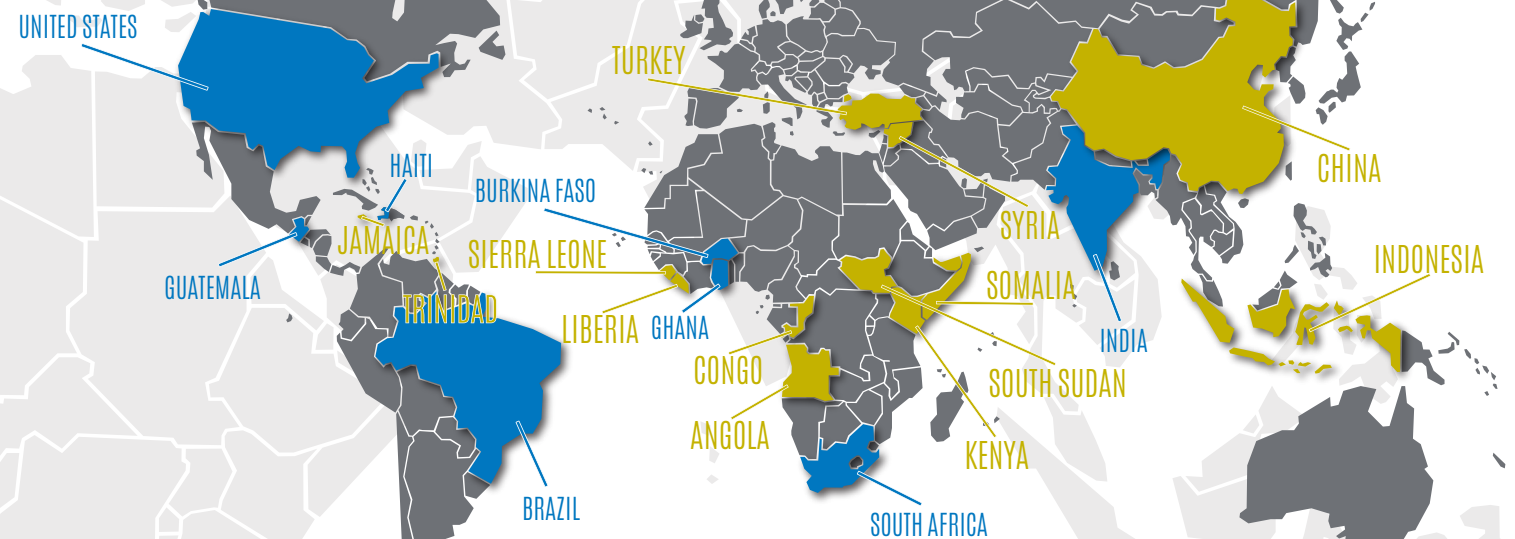

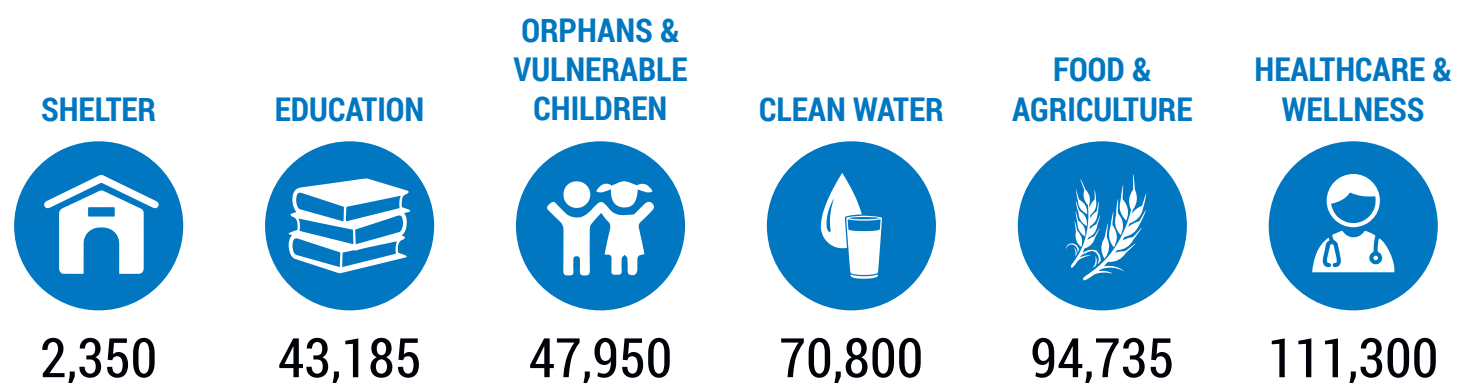

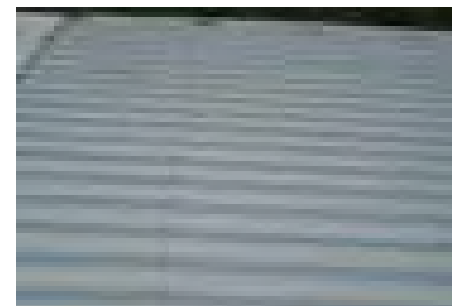


PRINGLE HOME FOR ABUSED WOMEN

CARRON HALL | ST. MARY | JAMAICA

The entire roof of the Pringle Home for Abused Women in Carron Hall St. Mary was leaking severely and was an inconvenience for normal functionality and daily activities of the Girls Home.

The girls were huddled together in the few rooms where the roof wasn't leaking entirely. JAGI reached out to officials of the home and offered to refurbish the roof of the home. The women can now live comfortably in

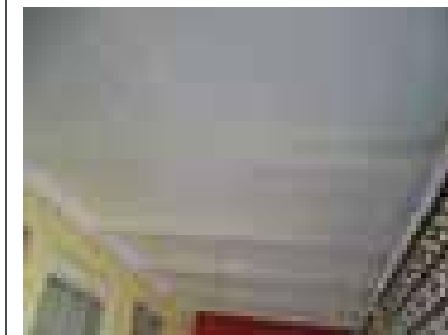


their home and continue to work through their treatment and recovery. The Pringle Home for Children has been caring for boys and girls for over 70 years. It is located in Carron Hall, St. Mary, Jamaica. Children come to the Pringle Home from situations of neglect and abuse, most having no one



to claim them as family. The Pringle Home provides assistance for these abandoned, orphaned and street children. Some of the services offered are education, recreation, employment and training.

A key impediment to the care and development of the children was the dilapidated condition of the home and the leaky roof. The Joseph Assignment replaced the leaky roof. While some basic patch work has begun to renovate the housing and other facilities, the physical infrastructure of the place desperately needs significant rehabilitation to meet just the basic housing needs of the children. Essentially, the scope of work ranges from upgrading the plumbing (bathroom facilities), electrical circuitry, to expanding the capacity of the home to reasonably



accommodate the already overpopulated home. The home is nestled in a remote mountainous section of Carron Hall which is not readily accessible to public transportation or within reasonable proximity to any of

the typical support services, grocery or other facilitation.

It is with that premise in mind that the Home Mothers and children alike organized an effort to raise chickens on the premises, to supplement the Home's food supply. Additionally, the residents implemented a farm project to grow essential vegetables, bananas, yams, and other ground provisions as part of a broader self-help strategy. The Joseph Assignment is working with them to expand their scope and assist to insure sustainability for food security is achieved.



RIVERTON CITY

RIVERTON | JAMAICA

In March 2015, Riverton City was the site of a major fire, starting on 11 March. The poor air quality brought a halt to activities in Kingston, as businesses, schools and other services were forced to close down early. The Medical Association of Jamaica called on the Cabinet to tackle the public health risks, saying that at least 600 people were rushed to the public health facilities as a result of smoke inhalation from the Riverton City fire. Dr. Felder saw the smoke and devastation and went to investigate because





she was told that people lived in the community. To our surprise the living conditions were devastating and very heartbreaking. The Joseph Assignment's plan is to transform the entire community.

Lands have been identified and cleared to construct a football field, netball court, basketball court and an After School Resource Centre in the Riverton Community.

The Joseph Assignment will find any possible way to empower the children, families, and community with the strength to participate in the ongoing development of their lives, so they can ultimately make decisions to help themselves.

HANNAH TOWN COMMUNITY CENTRE & NETBALL TEAM

HANNAH TOWN | KINGSTON | JAMAICA

The Joseph Assignment Global Initiative is a current sponsor of a netball team (STRIKERS). JAGI is proud to be the sponsor for this team and we are working assiduously with the team to make them successful in their endeavors.

We work to provide continuing professional development and opportunities for this female team to enter professional competitions through professional training.

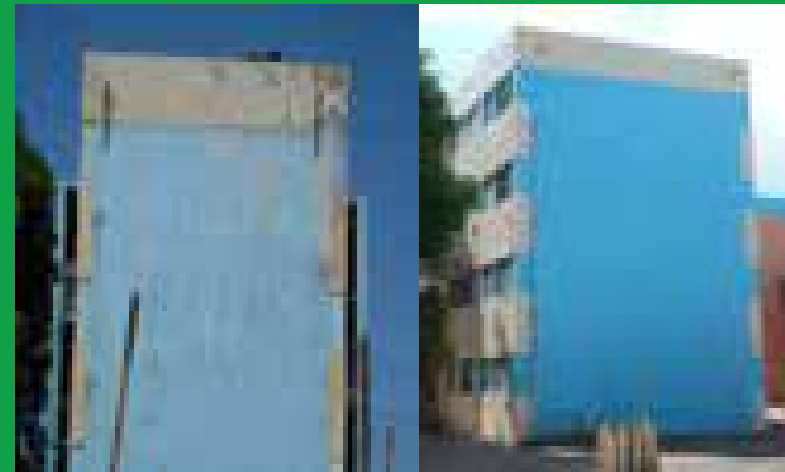


The Joseph Assignment has provided a certified computer technician to provide IT services for the Hannah Town Community Centre. These amenities are available to the people of the community, with JAGI providing the leadership that they deserve. This will also help to give some of the young minds positive things to do and keep them occupied. This is viewed by residents in the community as a social intervention tool.

TAVARES GARDENS

KINGSTON | JAMAICA

Thirty three (33) high rise buildings consisting of three and four floor levels was painted by the Joseph Assignment Global Initiative in Tavares Garden Kingston Jamaica. The homes had never been painted or refurbished since construction some fifteen years ago. The Joseph Assignment believes in not only supplying the resources, but also understands that true transformation is achieved when the people are transformed by work they accomplish together. The entire project was completed by the residents of the community. In spite of the community's known history for violent crimes and gang activity, the project was a huge success and the residents were very pleasant throughout. The residents are continuing their efforts by keeping the grounds clean and free from trash. The Joseph Assignment is currently developing plans for an urban farm in the community to continue its effort toward community transformation.



Tavares Garden Primary School is located in the center of the community. Like the housing units the school was in the same condition, in much need of paint and renovations. While the housing units were being painted, a team of residents started working on giving the school a facelift as well. This was done and the students now have a freshly painted school building. The Joseph Assignment will continue to provide support to the school for the enhancement of the students' learning aptitude.



HEALTH CLINIC & BACK-TO-SCHOOL DRIVE

In August 2015, during the School Summer break, the Joseph Assignment Global Initiative conducted a Health Clinic and Back to School Fair in four (4) Inner-City communities in Kingston Jamaica. The Communities consist of extremely poor families and as a result, the children normally suffer.

The communities that benefited from this initiative were: Water House, Riverton City, Tavares Gardens and Hannah Town. Over 3000 backpacks, Khaki Uniforms and School supplies were given out to these children and basic medical needs were met. These included proper teeth exams and cleaning for the children and blood sugar and blood pressure testing for the adults in the communities. Health related brochures and booklets were also handed out to the families.

The Joseph Assignment targeted these areas because they were some of the poorest areas in Kingston. Providing the health screening and providing the backpacks and school uniforms for the children is essential for a great start entering school for the year.

The road was long and winding.

There wasn't even a one kilometer stretch of tarred road in sight, after we branched off at Ajumako. With a soothsayer's accuracy, I could almost immediately tell I wouldn't enjoy the ride; bumpy was an understatement. I rose particularly early today. It was a

struggle considering the fact that I had clocked only five hours of sleep, after a long tiring day. I had chosen to save lives and I was about to do just that at the expense of my own sleep; the path I had chosen.



I could smell the freshness of the early morning dew; most of the journey was on a road carved through a thick rainforest. The journey had me in awe. First of all, I couldn't understand how people lived in such a rural setting; this was as rural as it got. If I lived here I would grow weary of the daily tiptoeing around the farm, wondering and worrying about which wild animal would have me on their menu. It looked like a place these creatures would thrive in. Maybe a leg for breakfast and an arm for brunch would be generous meals only a human could avail to them.

After about three hours bouncing up and down the bumpy road we finally arrived. I peeped through my hazy window and there was a throng of people waiting to welcome us. These individuals were excited, some to the brink of shedding tears, about seeing the bus pull over. My first thought was probably healthcare had not been served to these people in a while. It was likely some had thoughts of loved ones who they had lost rush through their minds, thinking we could have saved them had we come earlier; sad indeed.

We wasted no time in getting the

place set up. We had to start early in order to make it back to Accra before midnight by my estimation.

The crowd grew bigger with each person we saw, ironically. We had seen scores of people march to the doctors' desks to be assessed; the number should really have been diminishing but no. I could, with much certainty, say we had seen about a thousand people from this apparently small

village in the Central Region. There was a varying distribution of age groups with the elderly, young children, infants, babies evenly spread across the settlement. It was predominantly a farming community, so it was not surprising that the strong, vibrant middle aged group formed the majority.

Five hours had passed before we noticed our sweat paying off. We had

treated various disease conditions with malaria being the most notorious in the vicinity. We should have run out of antimalarial medication I murmured to myself. Kudos to the organizing team who procured more than enough for this demanding outreach. There you have it; top notch planning ensures optimal service delivery. Futile as it was, hypertension seemed to be competing with malaria for the top spot. The environmental conditions for survival favored the plasmodium-bearing mosquitoes.

It was fulfilling seeing the smiles on people's faces after hearing the reassuring words of medical professionals. Sometimes all people want is someone to grant an ear. Genuine medical problems were well addressed and minor surgical procedures undertaken with success. We were thrilled by the response of these individuals to our call to get healthcare problems taken care of.

It had been nine hours behind our desks when rain, heavy and furious, began to pour. We felt trapped; like we might not be able to make it back to



the capital the same day. Fortunately, the downpour was short lived. We unintentionally dug our feet into the muddy paths in an attempt to pack up. Obviously, we were successful after a few minutes and ready to make our return trip.

In the comfort of my window seat, I thought of all the other villages in obscure locations spread across Ghana. No effort is too small, I said to myself. If we all contributed our quota to our precious society in this small way, we would make a difference. Not everyone

in our country gets access to orthodox healthcare so people resort to alternative methods of treatment. These may work for a short period or may actually work very well but with subsequent consequences knocking at the door of these individuals who resort to such. I resolved to make outreaches an establishment of great value and the Joseph Assignment is the catalyst for making it a reality, not exclusively for Ghana, but also for the world. We arrived safely in the capital and departed after saluting each other for a job well done.

The path I, among others, had chosen once again gave me fulfillment and the smile is lingering.

We are now providing warm meals on a daily basis; the numbers have increased considerably, especially during winter. In the light of all this I wish to thank God for you and for the financial support you send each and every month. I also would like to thank the Joseph Assignment for the winter gloves and caps; these items are highly appreciated by the families and the children in our programs. Please keep praying for our projects and staff; we are all working fulltime as volunteers; we believe that God has called us to make a difference in people's lives.

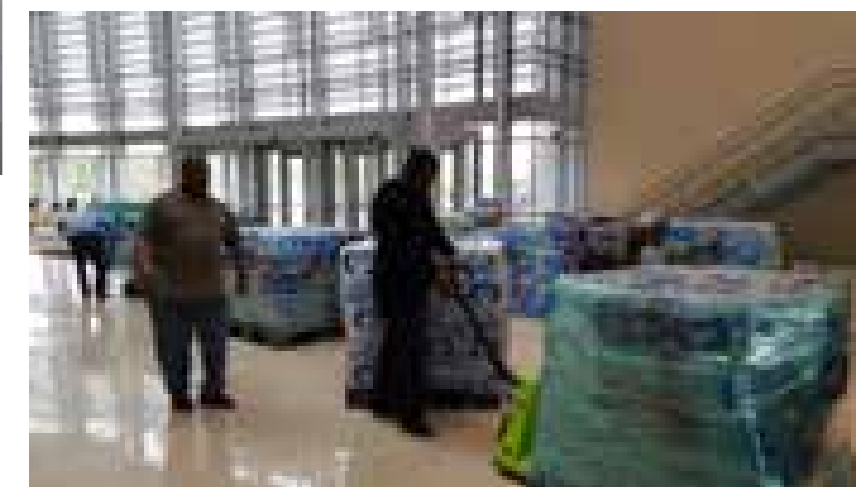

To date, The Joseph Assignment — in partnership with its primary administrative sponsor — delivered an ongoing source of over 500,000 bottles of water to residents living in Flint.

It's with great excitement and gratitude to announce the federal courts have ordered that

Michigan and Flint officials must deliver bottled water to any Flint home where the government hasn't verified that a filter is properly working, the latest ruling in a longstanding crisis over lead-tainted water in the city. According to the director of the American Civil Liberties Union of Michigan, the ruling judge, Judge Lawson, made a wise ruling that guarantees the residents of Flint will have access to reliable and safe drinking water until dangerous lead pipes have been replaced.
