

On September 17, 1787 the constitutional convention in Philadelphia came to a conclusion. Many citizens started gathering outside of the convention hall eagerly waiting on final results. For while the convention was initially called just to make *amendments* to the articles of confederation and, despite the fact that there was a convention rule that held all the proceedings to be confidential and not made known to the public, it was widely known that **the 1787 convention** completely **scrapped the articles of confederation** and had **developed something entirely new.**

Amid great speculation of what new form of government had been developed, the doors opened, and the convention attendees came out now free of the confidentiality order. Famously, <u>Ms. Powel of Philadelphia</u> went straight to Ben Franklin and asked, "**Sir, what have you given us?**"

His response:



Many of you have heard that story before, so let's put "rubber to the road" and discuss specific action in Michigan, for the American system of government requires individual responsibility to stay informed and engaged in the governance of our State and our Nation.

There is **<u>one key golden rule</u>** of politics about our system of government, indeed a corollary of Franklin's statement above:

"There will be no accountability at any level of politics unless there is accountability at the electorate level"

Let us never forget that truth has a special quality. With truth, we can combat lies very efficiently and effectively. Truth does not need a dollar for dollar match. With truth you can message effectively spending \$1 to combat \$1,000 of lies.

In more than 20 years of political organizing, it has become clear to me that the **globalists have a significant weakness that grass roots activists can exploit to great impact.** That weakness is the U.S. House of Representatives and the State Legislature.

While statewide positions like Governor, Senator, etc., lend well to the utilization of globalists tools (media, endorsements, slander, etc.), seats in State Legislatures and in the U.S. House of Representatives are far more vulnerable to a grass roots campaign.


Constitutionalists elected to positions in the State House or in the US House of Representatives would be able to use the **power of the purse** to simply cut off funding to all the outrageous excesses of government. They wouldn't even have to repeal things - they could just refuse to fund them! While this may seem a daunting task, the reality is you don't even need a majority of constitutionalists in any of these legislative bodies, you just need to have enough of them to tip the balance of power one way or the other.

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Let's take a look and see how the grass roots is doing in Michigan in key areas where they can be most effective:

 SB34 Collective Bargaining (Passed 20 to 16 on No 3/21/2023). Abolishes "right-to-work" provisions for private employees, eliminating their ability to refrain from labor organization and collective bargaining.

2. HB4032 Abortion (Passed 20 to 18 on 3/8/2023). Repeals No criminal sentencing guidelines for administering an abortion.

3. SB50 Juneteenth (Passed 37 to 1 on 5/17/2023). Designates Yes Juneteenth a public holiday on June 19th.


