The Chicago Zoological Society, which manages Brookfield Zoo, is proud to announce the birth of a male snow leopard cub on June 13.

The cub, who currently weighs about 10 pounds, is the first cub born to nearly 3-year-old Sarani and her mate Sabu, 3.

Since his birth the cub and his mom have resided in an off-exhibit den. Until the cub is 3 months old, he will remain there bonding with his mom before making his public debut in mid-September.

5K & Kids Dash At Arboretum

The Morton Arboretum will conduct its 10th annual Fall Color 5K Run & Walk and Kids Dash on Sunday, October 6th.

The 5K Run & Walk at 8 a.m. follows a challenging USATF-certified course along the East Side Main Route through rolling terrain. Runners are tracked using the ChronoTrack B-Tag timing system, and each runner will receive a technical t-shirt and recovery food and water. Awards will be given out in age and gender categories.

The Kids Dash for ages 2-10 begins at 9 a.m. and includes a cotton

t-shirt and participation ribbon. 2 to 4 year olds will race for 50 yards, 5 and 6 year olds will run a quarter mile and 7 to 10 year olds will complete a half mile.

The 5K Run & Walk fees are \$30 for nonmembers or \$35 on race day. The Kids Dash costs \$12 for nonmembers or \$15 on race day. Registration includes free admission to the Arboretum, and participants are encouraged to explore the 1,700 acres including the Children's Garden and Maze Garden following the race. Writing Contest For Grades 4-12

Secretary of State and State Librarian Jesse White is urging students in grades 4 through 12 to enter the 2014 "Letters About Literature" contest, a national reading and writing competition sponsored by the Center for the Book in the Library of Congress and the Illinois Center for the Book.

Students are invited to read a book of their choice and write a letter to the author about how the book changed their life or view of the world.

Students can enter on their own or through their schools, libraries or other youth organizations.

There are three levels of participation: Level I for grades 4, 5 & 6; Level

II for grades 7 & 8 and Level III for grades 9-12. One Illinois winner will be selected for each level and receive a \$200 cash award. Teachers of the winning students will receive a \$100 cash award to purchase materials for their school library.

Winners and teachers will be invited to an awards ceremony in Springfield. The state winners' letters will be forwarded for national judging. One national winner in each of the three competition levels will receive a \$1,000 cash award, and one national honor in each level will receive a \$200 cash award.

The deadline to enter is Friday, Jan. 10th for Levels I & II, and Tuesday, Dec. 10th for Level III. State winners will be announced in April.

CPS Reduces Student Tests

Chicago Public School Chief Executive Officer Barbara Byrd-Bennett announced the elimination of 15 District-mandated tests including elimination of fall standardized testing for all CPS grades.

This school year, 10 District-mandated standardized tests will be required across all grades. The new policy will provide school leaders and teachers with more autonomy in establishing assessments that help teachers develop instructional plans and align assessments with Common Core Standards.

Since February, CPS has hosted 17 focus groups with principals, teachers, parents, education advocates and researchers to gather feedback on the new assessment policy while incorporating input from 450 teachers who responded to a survey.

"Our education partners across the District—students, parents, teachers, principals, education stakeholders and researchers—contributed directly to the creation of this sensible, new policy that puts children and their learning first," said CEO Byrd-Bennett. "As a former teacher and principal, I felt that our parents and educators raised valid concerns around our testing policy, which is why we launched a rigorous analysis of that policy soon after I became CEO. This reflects their feedback and places a higher value on increased student learning time."

Beginning in SY13-14, the annual assessment calendar will limit standardized District testing to the spring for grades two through eleven and offer schools flexibility to select interim measures to monitor progress.

Each school's Instructional Leadership Teams—made up of teachers and school administrators—will be required to identify interim tests from either a District-provided menu of "school choice assessments" or alternate tests of their choice with the requirement that they are aligned to the CCSS, and engage students in activities that require critical thinking, writing and problem-solving.

Starting next school year, the Illinois State Board of Education will administer the Illinois Standards Achievement Test to students in grades three through eight. The new ISAT will begin to prepare Chicago students for the full transition to the CCSS, which is scheduled for all grades starting in school year 2014-15.
