Dept. of Education Says Schools Are Safer Now

The Department of Education recently released school safety numbers. While being careful not to sound content, they indicated that bullying and nonfatal crimes have greatly decreased. These statistics have been gathered since 1992.

I understand that collected data may not be consistent, but is a good sign because these are nationwide. You might remember when there was a push to prevent Conceal and Carry. Every shooting was listed by the school it was near.

I had a 13 year old girl shot on her front porch while sitting with her boyfriend at 3:00 AM. The headline was "Girl shot at certain school" and it was three blocks away from the shooting.

I had a 14 year old student killed because he was mistaken for his father, a gangbanger, the headline was "CPS student shot by such and such school" which was two blocks away from where he was shot.

Now these are not reported that way anymore. Administrators have gone through a period where the police wanted everything settled "in house". We believed it was so that there would not be as many reports filed.

The government report indicates that training about bullying seems to be doing its job. It also indicates a vast increase in security cameras. In 1999 only 19% of public schools used them and by 2014 that had risen to 75%.

The number of students who have reported being a victim of crimes like theft and assault has decreased by 82% since 1992. I know principals who hired off-duty Chicago Police officers, but let them go because

they sometimes needed special time for court. I am grateful I did not fall into that, and when I was at a very large school, found the money in my budget. I cannot tell you how much money the life a student, parent or teacher is worth, but this officer helped in some truly dangerous and possible lethal situations that some of my staff never became aware of. This is not a Chicago problem.

I had a PE teacher who told us that in the five years his girls were in a southwest suburban school, things had gotten so bad that security changed from two elderly ladies to six fully armed police officers.

The way things are, we must remain vigilant. Because so many parents worry, some of the schools tell me their biggest problem is danger due to traffic.

Everybody gets driven. They go through alleys and ignore signs. If you live near these schools, you know what they are talking about. One school in the area had over 900 kids in the past, now it only has 300. Yet there are so many cars, you can't get near the school.

The reality is schools are always soft targets "bad guys" know they can make a splash and disgruntled family members know where they can find the children or their ex-spouse. I had one school that had three buildings and ten exits. It made it a huge problem making sure the kids did not go with someone that the family was having a problem with, like an exwife, etc. and making sure they were not being whisked into a car. Do not feel ashamed to let the administration know about family problems, for on several occasions this knowledge helped me and my staff prevent possible disaster.



Lipinski Opposes TPP Trade Deal

Congressman Dan Lipinski (IL-3) released the following statement after the U.S. International Trade Commission (ITC) released their report on the economic impact of the Trans-Pacific Partnership.

"The ITC report shows that even under the best circumstances the TPP will continue the erosion of the American middle class. If approved, manufacturers and their employees will be hit the hardest by this trade agreement, with our manufacturing trade deficit increasing by \$24.1 billion per year.

"Unfortunately, even that bad number may be overly optimistic; my testimony included in this report outlines past issues with the ITC's analysis of the United States-Korea Free Trade

Agreement. Contrary to the predictions before that trade deal was passed, American workers have suffered greatly under it. My testimony on the TPP also outlined areas that I believe the International Trade Commission should have taken into consideration when completing their economic analysis, specifically the lack of attention to rules of origin provisions, currency manipulation, and the potential for depressed wages and job losses. Unfortunately, they didn't include those concerns.

"Americans can't afford another trade deal crafted by multinationals for themselves. I will continue to work to defeat TPP and any other trade agreement that doesn't benefit America's middle class, raise wages, and safeguard the consumer and environmental protections that we rely upon."
