### County Extends Economic Relief

In an effort to further assist residents and businesses during the COVID-19 pandemic, Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle announced an update to an expansive series of economic relief efforts announced last month.

Waiving a number of fines and fees and deferring the County's collection of various tax types by an additional month to correspond with the recent extension of the Illinois stay-at-home order through the end of May has the potential to put nearly \$45 million back in the hands of area businesses.

Due dates for Home Rule Taxes like the Alcoholic Beverage Tax, Amusement Tax, Tobacco Tax and Gasoline and Hotel Accommodations Tax will be pushed back as will numerous fines and fees under the jurisdictions of the Departments of Transportation and Highways, Environment and Sustainability, Revenue, Building and Zoning and Public Health.

## Chicago Creates Recovery Taskforce

Mayor Lori E. Lightfoot announced the creation of the COVID-19 Recovery Taskforce to advise city government as economic recovery planning efforts get underway. The Taskforce will be co-chaired by the mayor and former White House Chief of Staff Sam Skinner and led by a group of industry experts, regional government leaders, community-based partners and policymakers.

Five working groups will offer policy recommendations and plans to the Lightfoot administration. In recognition of the fact that Chicago's economy is interconnected with that of the region as well as the state, these sub-groups will also include participants representing the Chicagoland regional economy. The working group co-chairs include:

Policy & Economic Stimulus: Roberto Herencia, Chairman, Byline Bank; Mellody Hobson, Co-CEO, Ariel Investments; Bob Reiter, President, Chicago Federation of Labor and Jenny Scanlon, CEO, UL.

Mental & Emotional Health: Evelyn Diaz, President, Heartland Alliance; Karen Freeman Wilson, President & CEO, Urban League of Chicago and Alexa James, Executive Director, National Alliance on Mental Illness Chicago.

Marketing and Business Development: Sandra Cordova Micek, CEO, WTTW | WFMT; Richard Edelman, CEO, Edelman and Anton Seals, Executive Director, Grow Greater Englewood.

The Taskforce will address the following priority recovery areas. First, before the City can emerge from sheltering in place, it will need a plan to allow residents to cope with grief, fear and loss.

Second, the Taskforce will address unemployment. Since the crisis began, 17 million Americans have filed for unemployment, with more than 247,000 unemployment insurance claims filed in the Chicagoland region during the month of March.

The Marketing and Business Development working group will help reaffirm Chicago as a destination for businesses, workers, tourism and events.

The Taskforce will conduct a "change study" to gauge the full extent of economic hardship and provide a baseline for the city and business community.

The recovery efforts will be grounded in the work the Lightfoot administration is already doing with initiatives like its \$750M INVEST South/West program and Solutions Toward Ending Poverty agenda. The administration will continue to ensure economic relief is available for individuals and businesses hit hardest by COVID-19. This includes initiatives like the Chicago Small Business Resiliency Fund to deploy \$100 million in assistance for small business owners and entrepreneurs. The Housing Assistance Grant Program has allocated 2,000 grants for low-income renters and homeowners.

## IDNR To Reopen Select Sites

The Illinois Department of Natural Resources will reopen select state parks, recreation areas, fish and wildlife areas and trails beginning May 1st.

Visitors will be required to comply with social distancing guidelines and other COVID-19 best practices.

Visitors should bring alcohol-based hand sanitizer and face coverings.

These include Region 1 (Northwest Illinois): Argyle Lake State Park, Jubilee College State Park, Lowden State Park, Morrison-Rockwood State Park, Rock Island Trail, and Shabbona Lake State Recreation.

Region 2 (Northeastern Illinois): Chain O'Lakes State Park, Illinois and Michigan Canal State,

Kankakee River State Park, Moraine Hills State Park, and North Point Marina.

Visitors will be allowed to engage in activities such as wildlife observation, hiking, biking, equestrian use, fishing (both from the bank and boats) and mushroom collecting. Visitor centers, campgrounds, playgrounds, beaches and concessions will remain closed. There will be no shelter reservations, interpretive educational programs, and special events until further notice.

To ensure the safety of all visitors, hunting remains suspended.

IDNR sites are monitored by staff and Conservation Police. For assistance or to report violations, call the Office of Law Enforcement at (217) 785-0075.

## CARES Act Grants For Older Adults

The Department of Health and Human Services is announcing \$955 million in grants from the Administration for Community Living (ACL) to help meet the needs of older adults and people with disabilities as communities implement measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19. The grants will fund home-delivered meals, care services in the home, respite care and other support to families and caregivers, information about and referral to supports, and more. Illinois is receiving grants totaling \$32,154,806.

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act was signed into law by President Trump on March 27, 2020. The CARES Act provides supplemental funding for programs authorized by the Older Americans Act of 1965 and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014. Through these programs, a network of community-based organizations, such as Area Agencies on Aging, Centers for Independent Living, senior centers, faith-based organizations, and other non-profits provide a vast array of resources and services to help older adults and people with disabilities stay healthy and live inde-

pendently.

The need for these services has increased as community measures to slow transmission of COVID-19 have closed locations where many people typically receive services and made it difficult for families to assist loved ones who live alone. The adaptations necessary to provide these services in the current environment have increased costs to service providers.

## Endangered Frogs At Brookfield Zoo



Although Brookfield Zoo is closed to the public, animal care staff is dedicated to increase the population of the critically endangered Togo slippery frog, once thought to be extinct in Africa.

The species is found in one of two isolated regions in Ghana and along the border of Togo and Ghana – areas that total less than 4 square miles.

Unusual for its large eyes and large back legs, the frog grows to only about 3.5 inches. It spends 90 percent of its life in fast-flowing water, which is essential to its breeding success. Its evolutionary distinctiveness and global endangerment

environment for successfully breeding these elusive frogs. Surprising discoveries about the species, including the frog's unusual, high-pitched mating call that can be heard underneath crashing waterfalls, and a "sucker-disk" on its belly that provides traction in fast flowing water.

In 2015 and 2016, two small populations of the species were discovered in Togo streams by Pangolin Conservation. A group of tadpoles was sent to Brookfield Zoo where a breeding program began with the goal of maintaining a sustainable population.

CZS staff created a husbandry plan based on similar predominantly aquatic frogs. The tadpoles were divided into two groups and placed in a habitat that mimicked a separate water and pool system of their native environment.

Eleven tadpoles were brought to adulthood. Since the launch of this breeding program, more than 200 metamorphosed juveniles have been produced from the initial group of frogs, although not all survived. Several dozen tadpoles hatched recently at Brookfield Zoo. Specimens will be sent to other zoos in North America and Europe.

The techniques developed by CZS animal care staff were being used to help set up conservation breeding facility for the species in Ghana.

What remains of the small wild population is at risk due to habitat degradation caused by farming, logging, and mining. Togo slippery frogs are hunted for the bushmeat trade because the meat is high in protein. Andy Snider, curator of Herps and Aquatics said, "Some may ask, 'Why put so much effort into saving the Togo slippery frog?' Every living creature has a purpose, whether it provide a source of food for other animals or pest control by eating small invertebrates. It's a ripple effect when a species goes extinct."

### Free Rides From Domestic Violence

Mayor Lori E. Lightfoot announced a partnership with Lyft and Uber who collectively donated over \$20,000 to provide free rides for those seeking domestic violence services. These funds will be directed to the IL Domestic Violence Hotline at (877) 863-6338.

Residents seeking transportation and other services to flee a violent situation can contact the hotline which is available 24/7. Operators will deploy a driver from either Lyft or Uber to pick up the rider and transport them to a new location of their choosing. The requester's privacy will be protected.

Lyft also donated \$10,000 in ride codes to help in bringing food and supplies to the many people who are unable to leave their home. All residents, both current Lyft riders or first-time users, can use codes CHICAGOACCESS20 and CHICAGO-RELIEF20 for a one-time \$25 credit available for use on a first-come, first-utilized basis.

## Emergency Relief For Housing

Mayor Lori E. Lightfoot introduced an ordinance that would create a new \$3 million emergency relief package to stabilize affordable housing developments and keep thousands of men, women, and children safe and secure in their homes during and after the pandemic.

The Emergency Relief for Affordable Multifamily Properties Program ordinance will support up to 3,400 low-income households in 40 properties with grants or no-interest, deferred payment loans of up to \$75,000 to affordable housing owners to help cover lost rent, general operating expenses, additional cleaning and other related costs.


These loans and cash grants, supported by the

Affordable Housing Opportunity Fund, will keep affordable housing properties running during a time of widespread job loss, when renters face choices between paying rent and buying food.

The ERAMP grants and loans pair with the administration's earlier Housing Assistance Program, which provided 2,000 grants to renters unable to make rent and mortgage payments due to economic losses created by COVID-19.

The ERAMP program will go into effect upon approval by City Council. Applicants must complete an online application that will be hosted on the Department of Housing's website.



## County Launches COVID-19 Sites

Cook County, In Chicago, African Americans make up more than 60% of all COVID-19 deaths.

Visitors can pinpoint neighborhoods that may be experiencing surge, seeing the number and dates of death in those areas.

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention uses poverty, lack of transportation access, language barriers and others to describe the vulnerability of a community to human suffering and financial loss in the event of a disaster. SVI is a measure of the presence of these combined factors in a community.

The dashboard is updated daily at 6 a.m. and 4 p.m. and shows which areas of the County are hardest hit by the pandemic. Data gathered by the County's Medical Examiner's Office shows that African Americans account for half of all COVID-19 deaths in

### Internet Access For STLS Students

Chicago Public Schools announced that all K-12 Students in Temporary Living Situations will receive an internet access device in addition to a computing device.

The district invested \$2.5 million to purchase 11,200 devices that include four months of free internet service. The remaining 800 devices, which have phone and hotspot functionality, were generously donated by the Sprint 1Million Foundation.

The district estimates that approximately 12,000 CPS students are currently living in temporary living situations, which includes students who lack fixed, regular and adequate nighttime

residence, including a common scenario known as "doubling up."

The district's plan to support STLS students is part of its larger remote learning and device distribution strategy, which includes deploying more than 100,000 devices to students. Approximately 65,000 school-based devices are being provided to students and 37,000 new devices are being allocated to schools to supplement their existing inventory.
