

FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

A father tells the story about taking his four-year-old son, Josh, out to McDonald's for dinner; it was the "guys' night out." As they were eating their hamburgers Josh asked, "Daddy, what are these little things on the hamburger buns?" Dad explained that they were tiny seeds and that they were good to eat. Josh was quiet for a couple of minutes and his Dad could tell Josh was in deep thought. Finally, Josh looked up and said, "Dad, if we go home and plant these seeds in our backyard, we will have enough hamburgers to last forever!" Even though we know hamburgers do not grow from sesame seeds, Josh was right about one thing, tiny seeds can produce a large harvest.

Many times in the gospels Jesus compares the Kingdom of God to seed sown upon the ground. In grasping the message of this parable it is important to ask, "What is the Kingdom of God?" Simply put, it is God's reign in human life, when every heart will be governed by love. At that point, the world will live in peace. There will be no more pain, no more hunger and no more war. God's Kingdom came into this world with the birth of Jesus and by the power of the Holy Spirit his reign has been growing ever since.

In St. Mark's Parable of the Sower notice that the sower doesn't do anything but sow the seed. The growth of the seed from a little sprout to mature plant happens without the sower doing anything. This is true of the Kingdom of God. God is always at work behind the scenes taking the seeds of faith, hope and love we plant and causing them to grow in ways we least expect.

Unlike the world which looks for big signs and dramatic displays of power to show authority, the Kingdom of God appears in small and insignificant ways. Consider how God chose to come among us. Most people didn't recognize that the boy working with his father in a carpenter shop was the Messiah. Then, responding to the Father's call at age 30, Jesus began the work of sowing seeds with an insignificant group of followers. He didn't choose strong rulers, but simple believers whose hearts were open to the Father's love. They in turn sowed seeds in simple and varied ways.

In a similar way, we see the tiny seeds of God's Kingdom being sown all around us. I think of the wife who cares for her husband with Alzheimer's, sacrificing a great deal to keep him home. I see it in the child who starts a fund drive to raise pennies for victims of a house fire. I see it in the friend who challenges their buddy to stop texting while driving. I see it in the doctor who spends a couple of weeks in a third-world country to do reconstructive surgeries on patients. I see it in the man who cuts the lawn of a newly widowed neighbor. I see it in the words of encouragement given to a player who just struck out. These seemingly insignificant seeds of God's coming reign reflect God's dream for our world; a world governed by love, justice and peace.

Make no mistake about it, God is at work in our world. As someone once reminded me, "our inability to see doesn't affect God's ability to be." When we walk by faith and not by sight we learn to never give up on God. God is at work in all things, often in ways hidden from plain sight, providing the gifts of the Spirit to help us in our weakness. With the eyes of faith, we can see that God will accomplish more than we could ever imagine. Remain faithful because the best is yet to come!
