



School Use of Discretionary Funds

A very significant part of a Principal's responsibilities is setting the budget and explaining it so that it is approved by all those necessary. In the Chicago Public Schools this includes the Local School Council and in private schools there is some Board or Pastor. The section of the budget that the Principal actually controls are those not mandated by Board and Union rules and regulations. I always tried to keep personnel because I felt job security of staff is important as are the total number of staff in the building.

The question seems to be with dwindling funds and the Board's demands for higher Math and Reading scores, how do you help meet the needs of your entire student body? The discretionary funds in question are normally used in a few large areas. You can hire extra staff, arrange for after school programs or for summer programs, possibly even all three depending on the size of your school. I always felt that

safety and academics should go first. If I needed a security officer, I knew that would help everyone.

When considering new staff, I learned after many years that someone like a great Math teacher could be useful, but help was limited. Students seldom listed that teacher as a reason to come to that school every day.

However, a good coach or club moderator can be an incentive for better attendance and better grades if that was mandated as part of the program. Clubs and athletics when used properly can help attendance throughout the building. Examples like music classes, flag football, board games, attract different students and can have an effect for the whole building. Fewer and fewer kids than ever go to play outside after school, except in organized activities. I see several parks almost empty from 3 to 7 p.m. There are no more pick-up baseball games, three on three, and almost no one playing tag or jump rope. They all seem to be alone using their cell phones. So maybe after school activities fill a need. I was at a few schools that produced plays that included many students. They would be dropped from the play for poor grades or bad attendance -- this almost never happened.

My opinion changed over the years. Some students are never absent on extracurricular days. Some kids (like teachers) never take a day off if they have to miss PE or library. I had a few parents tell me their kid never missed those days. It gives them a reason to get up and get going because tardy students could not join in.

GED Classes At City Colleges

Richard J. Daley College, 7500 S. Pulaski, provides educational programs that help adults obtain a high school equivalency credential and gain the knowledge, skills, and guidance necessary for transition to college and career pathways.

In the Career Bridge program students prepare to earn their high school equivalency degree (GED/HISET) while learning about one of the following careers: Healthcare, Transportation, Distribution & Logistics, Information Technology, Early Childhood Education, or Culinary & Hospitality. Eligible students take a free credit class in the second semester.

In the Gateway to City Colleges of Chicago Program, Career Bridge completers and other eligible Adult Education students receive reduced tuition and supportive services for four semesters as they transition into credit certificate and degree programs.

In general, students must be at least 18 years old in order to enroll in GED classes. However, 16 and 17-year-olds may register with an official release letter certifying that they are no longer attending high school. Students who have F1, F2, H1, J1, or J2 visas are not eligible to enroll in GED classes, nor are students who are short-term visitors to the U.S.

Hard To Staff School Law

Assistant Majority Leader Iris Y. Martinez's measure expanding the ability of schools and future teachers to participate in the Grow Your Own Teacher program became law on July 26th.

The program is designed to train people to become teachers in hard-to-staff schools.

The new law will expand the definition of "eligible school" and "hard-to-staff" schools to include early childhood programs in which no less than 40 percent of the children it serves are receiving subsidized care under the Department of Human Services' Child Care Assistance Program.

It will also extend eligibility for participation to high school students enrolled in a dual credit course at a participating institution of higher education.

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
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
