

### **Spring Sewing Retreat – Camp Sew and Sew**

## **Reno Neighborhood Group**

Come join us for a sewing retreat in the mountains and a fantastic view of Lake Tahoe! Reno's annual sewing retreat, Camp Sew & Sew is now our sewing retreat because we are one chapter. The dates are Sunday, April 2, through Friday, Apr 7, 2023 and the event is held at the Zephyr Point Conference Center. The sewing area will set up for up to 24 participants with ironing and cutting stations in the room or nearby. Food is provided by the Center and the rooms have 2 (or 3) queen size beds with its own bathroom. We will be making some adjustments inside the workroom - all tables will be separate (one/table) and the center.

While it seems like a lot of effort to schlep your gear to Lake Tahoe, the benefits are many! Lots of good cheer, bragging rights abound, ohs and ahs as your projects progress during the week, and no interruptions except to socialize. Once set up, you are free to work when you want, and for however long you want! Best of all is no food prep - it's supplied by the Center! We have a coffee bar outside of the workroom, and someone is always up early to get the coffee started. Many bring munchies to go along with that coffee, tea, or whatever (I suggest you wrap them separately if they are handmade).

The price is \$570 or \$895 for double or single occupancy per room. Our new chapter - Gold Country ASG, is happy that we are continuing our springtime retreat and you can also attend their fall retreat! Fill out your registration form and remit with payment as soon as you can commit (members can delay payment until Mar 15 but should provide a registration form early to get their "spot"). We must have a headcount by March 15, 2023. There is a late fee added to applications sent after Feb 1, 2023. We are limited our numbers to 24 so that we have maximum workspace per attendee. **Registration form is below**.

Bring your choice of projects and enjoy the camaraderie, continuous sewing, food, and more. The sewing area is very large so we do anticipate having cutting tables available. We will be working in the Inspiration Point conference room (great views of the Lake).

#### **NOTES:**

- The sewing workroom is open/available from 4pm Sunday until noon on Friday.
- Also, there is no large parking area near our rooms/workroom, so you will have to drive down, drop off your sewing and personal items at the workroom, pick up your keys and settle into your room, then park back by the main lodge (and parking garage).
- Bedrooms will be in the Tallac Center on the first floor and the workroom access is from the first floor, middle of the building. Entrance at the middle of the building is on the 2nd floor; there is an elevator.
- No alcohol is allowed in public areas (cafeteria or sewing workroom).

All rooms have 2 queen size beds and a private bath. There are a limited number of 3-bed rooms.

### SEE WHAT OUR CHAPTER IS DOING











Attached are some photos from the tutorial that I led in <u>February's Sew Elegant</u> neighborhood group meeting. We made <u>Sewing Machine Needle Storage Cases</u>. The top grid (for storing single/gently used needles) was printed on my inkjet printer using purchased fabric sheets. I explored my stash of fabrics that I had picked up from "Free" tables over the past couple of years, and cut pieces to size. The rest of the materials (PelTex, batting, clear vinyl, zippers, and tissue paper) were cut and tucked in with the fabric to make assorted complete kits. Everyone could complete the project in one meeting because the kits saved a lot of time. At first the room was completely silent except for the hum of machines, as everyone studiously quilted over the printed lines on the grid. Then the usual chatter erupted as we worked through the project. Sewing techniques encountered were:

Use of double sided stiff PelTex -- Using a Teflon mat to protect an ironing surface -- Sewing on vinyl using tissue paper to prevent the foot from sticking -- One piece backing that is turned up at the edges to become the binding -- So we learned, sewed, laughed, and ended up with a useful sewing tool. That's what it's all about! Terry

8" squares that I've knit this past couple of months for our Knotty Knitters Neighborhood Group. Betsy Kerr sews all the squares together for blankets to donate for local charity needs. These squares are super easy to knit and are a great way to learn how to knit. We will teach you how (I am a Certified Knitting Instructor) when you visit our group meetings on the first Friday of each month, at 10:am. The ball of pink fluffy-knobby yarn was found on the "Free Table" at our recent Sewing Day Camp. Terry

The project this month at Sew Elegant was the Bijou Lovely Market Tote Bag which has a free pattern and online tutorial. Gail graciously volunteered to guide us through the assembly process. One of the ways we grow our sewing skills is from the knowledge sharing from our members. This is a core value of the American Sewing Guild, and our Gold Country Chapter.





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The selvedge edge striped bag/fabric was made by Sue Van Atta, the

colorful bonnet girl tote was by Teri Prouty, and the Feather Weight Sewing Machine bag was created by Gail Butler.
