Encouraging Reading

We, as parents, always go along with educator statements and the importance of reading. It is almost impossible to argue against this. We know our children that read best, have the best grades in Social Studies and Science. We realize this makes sense -- so we help our students when we encourage reading.

The strange situation for me is that during my career as an educator, I almost always had a second job and was attending graduate classes. Except for an occasional comic book or sports magazine I almost never read a book purely for pleasure. Seems I was always taking classes with mandated readings, which left very little time for non-directed reading. By the time my daughter was in 4th grade she probably had read more total books for pleasure than I ever did. It's true I've read more educational journal articles than I could ever count and my MA is in History and that I enjoyed.

As an educator I agree with the concept that the more students read for pleasure, the better they do in other subjects. So how should educators and parents encourage reading? I've had some great teachers work for me over the years and I've had some teachers get more excited about a new Harry Potter book than you can imagine. Same thing with The Hobbit and it did transfer to some kids. Many teachers have used book clubs, reading buddies, and contests to encourage reading. The latest is that the standard book report only

seems to help if the students choose their own titles.

After I became an administrator, I started reading articles from the National Association of Elementary School Principals. I recently found an interesting article by the National Panel on New Principals supported by this group and they have come up with a few ideas that I might have used if I were still in the field. It may be useful for some of our readers. They seem to have had success in encouraging students. A. Make a very special area in the classroom for silent reading -- I worked with teachers who built castles or used old refrigerator boxes. All the kids want to be in these areas. You might have the room to do something like this at home. B. Read recipes, try it, taste it and write about it. Although recent laws prevents them for bringing in a taste, this can be done at home. C. "Speed dating" students move through areas that have different genre of books, hoping to raise interest. D. Flashlight Friday -- kids come in with a flashlight, teacher darkens the room and the kids get to read with only the light of the flashlights. The primary students I taught would probably love this, while I would be very careful with my 8th graders. E. Challenge the Principal -- if a certain number of books are read, the principal or other individual could be dunked, or have to eat a worm, I'm sure you could think of other ideas that you would have loved to have your principal do if the numbers were met.

You can think of other things, but age and interest of the children is important. The kids all expect their teacher to push reading. How special of an impression a parent would make, not just expecting a good grade, but trying one or two of these at home especially now with summer coming up.

Open Hearing For I-55 Lane Project

The Illinois Department of Transportation will host a public hearing on the final environmental report for the proposed addition of a managed lane on Interstate 55 at the Holiday Inn Country-side Conference Center, 6201 Joliet Road, Countryside on Tuesday, May 17th from 4 to 7 p.m.

The project could add one express toll lane within the existing median of I-55 between Interstate 355 and Interstate 90/94.

The public is invited to review the report and offer comments. Exhibits will be on display and an audio-visual presentation will be shown continuously. Project team members will discuss the project and answer questions. At 6 p.m., a court reporter will be present to take statements from attendees.

Prepaid Tuition Plan For College Illinois

Students are completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to determine their eligibility for federal, state and institutional aid for college. The College Illinois! 529 Prepaid Tuition Plan, can help students graduate from college with little or no loan debt.

The plan offers a way to prepay the cost of college tuition for a child or grandchild, so their college education is covered at a school within their plan no matter how much financial aid is available and how high tuition increases by the time they are ready to attend.
