



## The Issue Of Legalizing Marijuana

This weekly column has been evolving over the past six months as I have been collecting data. As always, the article is for teachers and parents using as much information as I can from both student and parent groups.

It is a complicated issue of legalizing marijuana. This may be oversimplifying the issue, since I have seen 300 page articles on this issue. For this reason I have used student anecdotes and articles from the Sun-Times, Tribune, Dr. Oz, Dr. Ray Gerendi, The National Geographic, along with material available at Cannabis dispensaries and The Journal of The American Medical Association. You can find numerous articles on the internet, but if you are interested, this is a place you can start.

The big areas are: medical use, recreational use, taxes, and the way some people get rich. Today we deal with recreational use. First, there are no proven scientific studies supporting most claims, either for or against its use. But it is acknowledged that the legal age of 21 seems to cause some concern.

The vast majority of pot smokers begin by the time they are 14. The vast majority of these people have quit by age 25. This may or may not be what you have witnessed, but they are the stats.

Many who deal with young people hear the argument, it is no different than alcohol. That is true in some ways. You can get a high on both, and, in moderation, there

is little problem with either. The advantage of alcohol is that the body rids itself through urine, at a pace that is usually constant. This is not true of marijuana as it goes to the brain.

In most people, reaction to alcohol is constant for the individual. If you get sleepy, that is what happens to you. If you get mean, that is what happens and this could be many different effects. This is not always true of marijuana.

In states that legalized recreational marijuana, it is still not allowed in the streets or in vehicles. One might say that is an advantage for marijuana because a smoker has no accepted test to prove impairment when a driver is stopped. Marijuana can give its effects in seconds after inhalation and peak within 30 minutes which is quicker than most obtained with alcohol.

I had a senior citizen tell me "I have no desire to use it, but if they're going to use it anyway, we might as well get tax money out of it". It is true that some states have a huge increase in tax revenue, but as more states make it legal, many states are not obtaining the tax revenue they thought they would. There seems to be an issue with every taxing body wanting their share. For that reason, they cannot keep their price competitive with the illegal drugs being sold on the streets. As we know, most young people can't buy it legally anyway.

I hope this helps you start looking at this issue because your state officials will be voting soon. Next week, I'll touch on the issues of medical marijuana and CBD oil.



**CDOT Opens Paving Season**

Mayor Rahm Emanuel launched the 2019 Paving Season on Archer ave. in the 23rd Ward with Alderman Silvana Tabares and the Chicago Department of Transportation. **IDPH Promotes Immunization Week**

2019 marks the 25th Anniversary of National Infant Immunization Week April 27th - May 4th. When the observance was established, the U.S. was in the midst of several outbreaks, the largest of which was among Illinois and Missouri residents. Decades of increased vaccinations led to the declaration of measles being eliminated in 2000. However, the country is once again seeing measles outbreaks. Illinois Department of Public Health Director, Dr. Ngozi Ezike is asking parents to talk with a health care provider to ensure their children are fully immunized.

"Because of the success of vaccines in preventing disease, parents may not have heard of some of the serious diseases they prevent. Children can suffer serious illness and even death when exposed to diseases like measles, mumps, and pertussis," and Dr. Ezike. "Although vaccines are among the most successful, safe, and cost-effective public health tools available for preventing disease and death, some people still chose not to be vaccinated. It is essential that you protect your children against illness by having them vaccinated before they are exposed to potentially life-threatening diseases."

As of April 26th, there have been more than 700 cases of measles in the U.S. this year, including 78 new cases identified last week. Although Illinois data do not reflect the same trend, the U.S. is seeing an increase in the number of children younger than two years old who are receiving no vaccines.

Public health officials

are working with schools, community organizations, religious groups, parent organizations, and other stakeholders to identify opportunities to provide vaccinations.

IDPH continues to recruit and retain Vaccine for Children, health care providers, a federally funded program that provides vaccines at no cost.

Through on-time immunization, parents can protect infants and children from 14 vaccine-preventable diseases before age two.

In the 1950's, nearly every child developed measles, and some developed serious complications including death.

Today, many practicing physicians have never seen a case of measles due to the effectiveness of the vaccine. They are still commonly transmitted in many parts of the world and brought into the country by unvaccinated individuals, putting other unvaccinated people at risk.

**Colobus Monkey Born at Brookfield Zoo**



An Angolan colobus monkey was born at Brookfield Zoo on March 11th. He can be seen with his mom, Tina Turner, in the Tropic World: Africa habitat.

Colobus infants are born completely white, which is great camouflage as they blend in with their mom's long white hair. At about a month old, the young monkey begins to change color. Zoogoers will notice the monkey's eyes and arms are changing to black. He will reach adult coloration at approximately three months

of age. Guests may also notice the infant's mom sharing maternal care with the other females in the group. Angolan colobuses allo-parent, meaning that other members in the group take turns carrying the baby. Mom will retrieve her baby when she wants to hold him or when he needs to nurse.

Angolan colobuses are found in dense rain forests throughout equatorial Africa. These animals are the most arboreal of the African monkeys, spending most of their time in the canopy. The species is threatened in parts of its range due to habitat destruction for timber and for agricultural use. In certain areas, such as the Congo Basin, people hunt them for meat.
