Perhaps the most illustrious individual listed is from Lancaster's 2nd Ward... **William T. Sherman**.

Tunis Peters-members of Turkey Run Baptist church- helped found it- Rt. 188- in Cockade Reg of War of 1812- with sons Gresham and John He and his wife are buried at Turkey Run.

Henry Kiger- (c.1779-1879) tombstone says over 100 years- buried at Turkey Run-Am. Twp- served 7 m. 3 weeks. At Wash. After burning of capital, walked up steps and viewed the ruins.
