

An Important date in your 8th grader's life is Jan. 11th, when all Catholic High Schools have their entrance exam. The history of our community has been filled with our families boot-straping themselves to a better life with the utilization of education, many in the Catholic school system. Bridgeport has lost St. Barbara's High School and St. Mary of Perpetual Help. The Back of the Yards lost St. Joseph High School and St. Augustine High School. Many of our residents attended Lourdes, Quigley North and South, and Maria, all of which have closed.

Making Literacy A Family Affair

Parents in schools across the nation are learning how to bring literacy into their homes and it starts with mom and dad going to class. The National Centers for Learning implemented a family literacy program a decade ago in 30 cities, and a new report shows that as a result, parents are better equipped to help their children succeed in school.

All parents in the schools reported that the greater benefit of family literacy is their own sense of increased support for their children's education. These parents are more likely to attend conferences and after-school programs and the students are demonstrating good behavior and regular attendance.

The report found that the program narrowed the achievement gap among African Americans, Latino and Hispanic Americans, as well as their white and Asian American counterparts. In households where English is not the primary language, it had extra benefits for parents.

Children's achievement test scores outrank those of other children in the school and in the program, plus the parents are much more engaged. The parents who are not English-speakers start to speak English and start to interact with the schools.

NCFE's Toyota Family Literacy Program is the first national family literacy program created to address literacy needs of Hispanic and immigrant families with children in kindergarten through third grade.

Dolphin Births At Brookfield Zoo



Chicago Zoological Society animal care specialists continue to be cautiously optimistic with the progress of two male dolphin calves born at Brookfield Zoo: a 8-week-old dolphin calf that marine mammal staff has been handrearing around the clock since his birth and a 10-week-old calf, the fifth to be raised by Tapeko, his 31-year-old mother.

"We are pleased with the progress the handreared calf has made during his first 8 weeks of life," said Jennifer Langan, DVM, Dipl. ACZM, associate veterinarian for the Society. "However, he still remains in guarded condition as he has several milestones he needs to achieve over the next few months before we would consider his situation less critical, including eating solid fish on his own, being introduced to the other members of the dolphin group, and finally becoming independent."

The calf being handreared was born to Spree, 11, on Oct. 28th. Spree, an inexperienced mother, was not providing adequate maternal care. The Animal Programs staff made the decision to intervene to provide necessary neonatal care.

The 10-week-old calf born on Oct. 16th to Tapeko continues to do very well. Marine mammal staff monitored him around the clock for the first 30 days of his life, which is the most critical period. During this time, staff used EthoTrak, an electronic behavior-monitoring program that was developed by a team of Chicago Zoological Society

computer programmers and biologists and is now used by other zoos around the country. Marine mammal staff recorded nursing bouts, slippstreaming behavior, and other developmental behaviors. Observations will continue on the calf's development as well as the social dynamics of the dolphin group.

The Seven Seas Underwater Viewing Gallery has reopened so that guests will be able to view Tapeko's calf when he has access to the main pool. In addition to Spree and Tapeko and her calf, other members of the dolphin group that can be seen include Chinook, 30, the sire of both calves; Allie, 26; Noelani, 10 and Allison, 8.
