**WHO MAY ENTER:** Juniors age 11 and under will receive a Junior Exhibitor Identification Card. Exception: State Baking Contest and Litchfield County Contest open to age 15 and under.

**ENTRY BLANKS:** See general rules.

**ENTRY TAGS:** Must be securely fastened to exhibit. See general rules.

**NON-LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS:** See general rules for exhibit delivery and removal.

**DELIVER EXHIBIT:** To Junior Barn, **Thursday from 6 to 9 pm. No exhibits will be accepted on Friday. Exhibits must remain until 5:30 pm Sunday.**

**ENTRY FEES:** None, unless Junior Exhibitor is entering an adult baking contest, State Two-Crusted Apple Pie Contest, or Giant Pumpkin. In these cases, Junior Exhibitors must include entry fee (see general rules).

## DEPARTMENT RULES

1. Entries must be the **original** work of the exhibitor.
2. Exhibits must remain until **5:30 pm Sunday.**
3. Exhibitors may enter **only one exhibit in any class number.**
4. Items entered in the Bethlehem Fair in previous years may not be entered again.
5. Entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Committee. **Exhibits can be no larger than 24" x 24".**
6. **Collections and displays must be set up on a suitable board or mounted so they can be easily moved by the Committee. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any exhibit that cannot be easily handled.**
7. The Bethlehem Fair is not responsible for loss or damage to exhibits. The Fair will see that reasonable care is exercised during the period of the show.
8. All clothing entries must be clean, pressed, and on hangers.
9. All artwork must be framed or quality matted with complete hanging facilities.
10. The Junior Identification Card or Exhibitor pass must be presented to pick up exhibits at the close of the Fair.
11. A rosette will be awarded to the exhibitor with the most points as follows: Blue 3 points, Red 2 points, White 1 point.
12. Junior exhibits will be judged under the Danish system. All exhibits are judged on their own merit and not in competition with other entries. Premiums will be paid as follows: **Blue \$3.00, Red \$2.00, White \$1.00.**
