

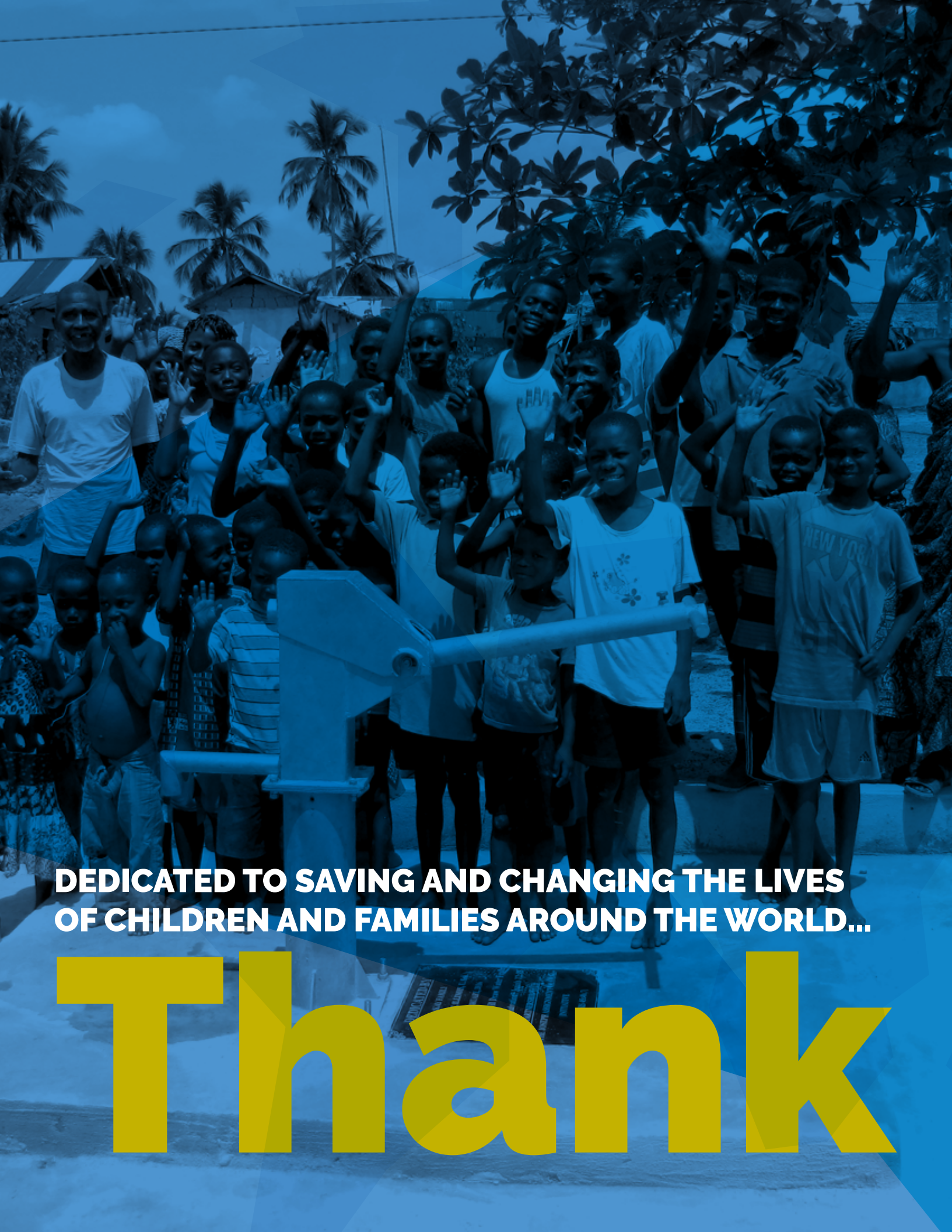

A WORD FROM OUR FOUNDER



God has heard your prayer and remembered your gifts to the poor.



The Joseph Assignment Global Initiative is honored to represent your love and support to the world's poorest children and families through sustainable initiatives. Recently, I was challenged by some well-intended individuals in a class setting who asserted we are simply a charitable organization and Jesus' work is not limited to charity but advocates for justice. While I completely agree about the latter, I emphatically disagree with the premise of their assessment: it is deficient in both knowledge and analysis. In order for humanity to be kingdom minded or true followers of Christ several foundational principles must be enacted:

1. We Must Take Dominion (Gen.1:26-28) - This means all hands on deck to provide stewardship of the Earth and all of its creation. In other words, every human being must be fed, educated and given tools and opportunities to make positive contributions to society. Advanced treatments and cures for various diseases afflicting humanity reside in the potential of children living in remote African villages and other nations suffering chronic extreme poverty, denied schools and educational tools to overcome generations of illiteracy and unlock their gifts. You transform those lives by building schools, libraries and computer labs (if electric grid is accessible) for children during the day and adult literacy at night. You provide lunch programs 5 days a week, drill clean water wells, and provide free medical care. You manifest the 6 core areas of service for people who will earn less than the equivalent of \$10 USD a year. Thus you equip global citizens for effective stewardship of human communities and the planet (air, water, etc.); which gives ultimate Glory to God.

2. Love is Positive Action (Prov. 19:17; Heb. 13:16) - The profound but simple truth of John 3:16 is that it establishes giving as the norm for human endeavor and the power of Love/charity for the promotion of social justice. God through Christ gives everlasting life. True followers of Christ are called and commissioned to eliminate the unwarranted expiration of life caused by systems of poverty, exploitation and denial of opportunity. Only God through Christ has power to give everlasting life, but we have the God-given power to save and uplift lives of the dispossessed. Love/charity demands your commitment to the provision of greater works (John 14:12). The universality of God's love for humanity compels us all to advocate, develop and provide opportunities for productive lives and full participation in human progress for those in the greatest need. Love/charity as embodied by Jesus encompasses giving support to sustain basic needs; enactment of national and international laws and transformation to economic systems which leave no human beings behind. This is justice which gives Glory to God.

3. Justice and Not Just-Us (Is. 1:17; Jer. 22:3; I Cor. 10:24; James 2:15-16) - The definition of Justice as Jesus envisions it is portrayed in his parable in Matthew 25. "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me." When "the righteous", bewildered, ask "the King": "When did we {do these things for} you?" the King answers: "I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers {and sisters} of mine, you did for me." Such is the radical justice of Jesus Christ: that individuals, communities, churches and nations are Divinely judged by our willingness to give and work for the uplift of the poor and dispossessed, and for transformation of corrupt systems that create and maintain poverty and vast economic inequity. Uplifting the least of these gives Glory to God.

4. Recognize A Kingdom Citizen is a Global Citizen (Prov. 11:30; Is. 6:8; Matt. 28:19-20) - The assignment given to all followers of Jesus Christ is global in nature. This is explicit in the Great Commission of the resurrected Christ: Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19). This truth is more urgent in the 21st Century than ever in human history because functionally we are a global village. Poverty is a global phenomenon, created by global greed and corruption, maintained by global systems of economic, political and social injustice. As Martin Luther King Jr. framed it: "Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere. We are caught in an inescapable network of mutuality, tied in a single garment of destiny. Whatever affects one directly, affects all indirectly." Thus, any vision that claims Jesus as its inspiration must be global: any vision that is not global is impaired vision. Indeed, "For God so loved the world..." (John 3:16). Love in action for global justice gives Glory to God.



A WORD FROM OUR FOUNDER (Continued)

The Joseph Assignment Global Initiative operates with the understanding of the distinction between subsistence and opportunity, and recognize both as essential human needs. On your behalf, The Joseph Assignment provides effective tools for sustainable development all to the Glory of God.

We rely on faithful support of donors like you to partner with us in all of our core areas of service: healthcare, education, clean and safe drinking water, services to orphans and vulnerable children, shelter, food/economic development through farming, implementation of green technologies, and ecosystem preservation methods within villages in order to lay foundations for transformation.

You are facilitating economic development in impoverished communities through farming cooperatives utilizing green technologies. You Are The Good and Faithful Servant (Matthew 25:23)!

JAGI is dedicated to the principle that compassion must produce action that cultivates transformation and promotes holistic living. Together we can reshape the world in conformity to the vision: just because persons are born into poverty does not mean they are destined to live in poverty.

I am honored and humbled to represent your love and care to those living in extreme poverty. Together we are changing the world all to the Glory of God.

EDUCATION

134 million children between the ages of 7 and 18 have never been to school.



Girls are more likely to go without schooling than boys.

Children are more likely to be forced into child labor if they are not attending school.

HEALTHCARE

Measles, malaria, and diarrhea are three of the biggest killers of children.



More than 30 million children are not immunized against treatable or preventable diseases.

1 in 4 children who die before age 5 die of water-related diseases.

In most housing structures, 5 to 12 people share one 10' x 10' room. The structural quality is very poor and dangerous in most thatch and clay homes.

Poor housing means diseases spread more rapidly.

FOOD




Hunger kills more people every year than AIDS, Malaria, and TB.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

Board of Directors The Joseph Assignment Global Initiative Matteson, Illinois

We have audited the accompanying combined financial statements of The Joseph Assignment Global Initiative (a nonprofit organization), which comprise the combined statements of financial position as of December 31, 2016 and 2015, and the related combined statements of activities and cash flows for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Opinion

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above, present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of The Joseph Assignment Global Initiative as of December 31, 2016 and 2015, and the changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the years then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

In our opinion, the information is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements as a whole.

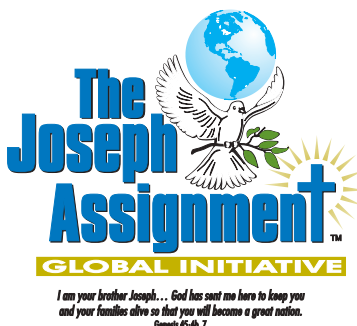
