

Bonus Vocabulary words:

Perspective: a way of seeing situations or topics from your own point of view

Interpretation: an explanation that results from seeing something.

a piece of information about something presented as true and accurate

example: Ms. S's car is black.

why?: The picture of Ms. S's car proves that it is black.

Something told or written that is not fact

or a made-up story

example:

The pumpkin became a carriage.

why?: Pumpkins cannot be driven or turned into carriages.






