 Township trustees in Incorporating Amanda Ohio MEETING of the
 From the Record of the Township trustees. FORM 2
 HELD January 10th 1903

The following accompanying petition with plat (see Trustees Record for same) was duly presented and trustee Obed Brown offered the following Resolution:

Whereas the board of trustees of Amanda township Fairfield county Ohio, are satisfied that the petition praying for an election for Incorporating the Village of Amanda Fairfield county, Ohio, as shown by plat & is regularly and lawfully presented according to the provisions of Title XII, Division, 2, Chapter, 2, Section 1561 of the Revised Statutes of Ohio: Therefore be it Resolved That the petition be received and the prayer of said petitioners granted, the resolution was seconded and unanimously carried.

Trustee Peter Kessler then offered the following Resolution: Resolved, That the trustees of Amanda township, Fairfield county, Ohio, order a Special Election of the qualified electors of the proposed village of Amanda, Fairfield county Ohio (as shown by the accompanying plat of said village) to be held at the usual place of holding elections, On Saturday January 24th 1903, between the hours of 5:30 A.M. and 5:30 P.M. central standard time. To determine by ballot, whether, or not such territory shall be incorporated as the Village of Amanda, Fairfield county Ohio. the resolution was seconded and carried by a unanimous vote.

The township clerk was instructed to post notices and publish notices of said election according to law

From minutes of meeting trustees of Amanda township Fairfield county O. Special Election for the Incorporating the Village of Amanda, Fairfield county Ohio. All members present met in I.O.O.F. Hall (the usual place of holding elections). The president of the board, F. E. Jennings, declared the polls opened at 5:30 A.M. and the same were kept open until 5:30 P.M. The trustees, F. E. Jennings, Peter Kessler and

J. R. Hewetson, as clerk of said election.

The number of electors voting at said election was Ninety one (91) and the number of votes For Incorporating was Seventy nine (79) and the number of votes Against Incorporating was Ten (10) — A proper and lawful certification was made of the result.

The number of votes For Incorporating being a majority of all votes cast at said election the trustees by virtue of the power vested in them by Section 1561 (c) of the Revised Statutes of Ohio: Order and declare that said territory shall be and the same is hereby incorporated as the Village of Amanda in Fairfield County Ohio: and the same was properly certified to the Recorder of Fairfield County in Lancaster, O.

The agents for the Incorporation, E. W. Boerstler and Jacob Balthaser having made the necessary and lawful provisions for the election of village officers:

The following minute of said election was prepared from the returns as canvassed by J. R. Hewetson the township clerk

The election was held in connection with the election for township officers April 6th 1903, conducted by S. F. Highland, L. W. Steward, John Phillips and C. C. Bussert as judges and W. E. Barr and W. A. First regular meeting of the council of the Village of Amanda, in Fairfield county Ohio.

According to the provisions of Section 195 of the Municipal Code the council met in regular session.

The returns of the election of village officers were read and the result verified.

The clerk elect J. R. Newetson presented his certificate of qualification as Village Clerk, and the oath of office was administered to Francis Reichelderfer, C. H. Newton, and George A. Lutz, as members of the council for three years, and Theodore Lape, W. A. Cromley, and Richard Warner, members of the council for one year.

Through a misunderstanding the Mayor elect did not preside, and Francis Reichelderfer was chosen temporary chairman and called the council to order.

The council then proceeded to organize by unanimously electing Francis Reichelderfer as President pro tem.

The proposition of the I. O. O. F. trustees to rent or lease to the village the room in I. O. O. F. hall for a Council chamber, Mayor's office etc for one year with the privilege of three or five years at Thirty five dollars \$35⁰⁰ per year, light, fuel, furniture, and book case furnished and village to have privilege of erecting a temporary jail on the lot in rear of said hall the same to be removed at desire of village, was presented and by motion the same was accepted.

The council then by motion adjourned to meet on Monday evening May 8th 1903 at 7³⁰ p. m.

Pursuant to adjournment the council of the village of Amanda in Fairfield county Ohio, met in I.O.O.F. hall. The council was called to order by the Mayor Isaac Tatman.

The roll call showed the following members present C. H. Newton, Francis Buchelderfer, George A. Lutz, Theodore Lape, W. A. Crowley and Richard Warner, the treasurer C. H. Sunderman, and Marshal L. E. Conrad were also present.

The minutes of the last session were read and approved as read.

The clerk read the lease for the room in I.O.O.F. hall for a Council chamber Mayor's office etc. and the following ordinance viz:

Ordinance No. I. To Lease room for Council chamber, Mayor's office etc. Be it ordained by the council of the village of Amanda, in Fairfield county Ohio. Sec 1. That the council of the said village lease the room in the I.O.O.F. hall for the period of one year with the privilege of three or five years and ground for the erection of temporary jail on lot in rear of said hall according to the terms of said lease. Sec 2. This ordinance shall be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

By motion the rules were suspended, and the same was passed roll call all present voting aye.

The committee on By Laws and Ordinances made a partial report and submitted the following ordinances.

Ordinance No. II. To regulate salaries of officers for the year 1903. Be it ordained by the council of the village of Amanda in Fairfield county Ohio: Section 1. That the salaries of the officers for the year 1903 shall be as follows viz:

Treasurer C. H. Sunderman presented his bond in the sum of \$2000.00 with sureties S. T. Highland and John Hosler and the same was approved

The oath of office as treasurer of the Village of Amanda Fairfield county, Ohio. was administered to C. H. Sunderman

The Mayor appointed Harley Crites to be Street Commissioner for the ensuing year and by motion the appointment was confirmed roll call as follows, C. H. Newton, aye; George A. Lutz, aye; Francis Reichelderfer, aye; W. A. Crowley, aye; Theodore Lake, aye; Richard Warner, Nay.

The council then by motion adjourned to meet Monday May 18th 1903 at 7³⁰ p.m.

Motion by C. H. Newton That the council adopt the by laws read article by article and motion was seconded and carried. By motion Article II as read was adopted and by motion Article III was adopted as read. Article IIII was read and by motion adopted as read. Article IV as read was adopted. By motion Article V was amended to read as follows. Article V - Salaries and bonds Section 1. The salaries of the officers for the year 1903 shall be fixed by ordinance. Section 2. The bonds of the officers for the year 1903 shall be fixed by ordinance and by motion Article V as amended was adopted.

Article VII was read and by motion was adopted as read.

The Finance Committee was continued. The committee on Supplies Lights etc made a partial report and stated a proposition from a company to furnish three or more lights on 30 days trial. a motion was made to accept the proposition and order three lights on trial, the motion carried.

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in Fairfield county Ohio: That the Finance committee be authorized to borrow for 1 year the sum of Three hundred dollars, \$300.00 to be expended for the General expenses of said Village during the ensuing year.

A motion to adopt the Resolution as read carried by a unanimous vote, roll call, all present voting aye. The following ordinance was introduced—

Ordinance No IV — To regulate Fast driving upon the village streets — Be it ordained by the council of the Village of Amanda, in Fairfield county Ohio:

Section 1. That there shall be no fast driving, racing of horses or speeding of them for purposes of exhibiting same upon the streets of said village under penalty provided by statute Section, 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law. A motion to suspend the rules and pass the same carried, roll call, on same C. H. Newton, aye; Francis Buchelderfer, aye; Theodore Lape, aye; George A. Lutz, aye; W. A. Crowley, aye; and the same was declared adopted.

By motion the committee on supplies was authorized to purchase at once the necessary supplies.

The minutes were read and by motion the council adjourned to meet Monday night May 25th 1903.

To license Shows, Public Entertainments, Peddlers etc. Be it ordained by the council of the Village of Amanda in Fairfield county Ohio.

Section 1. That all Theatrical Exhibitions and Public Shows of whatever name or nature for which money or reward is demanded or received shall pay for the privilege of same as follows, viz: For the first performance \$2⁰⁰ For the second performance \$1⁰⁰ and for each subsequent performance 50 cents; Section 2. That the privilege of selling at retail upon the streets of the aforesaid village from or by means of a peddler or otherwise; of Patent Medicines; of Dry Goods; of Notions; of Wares and of Merchandise, shall be charged for each day \$2⁰⁰ and for each night \$2⁰⁰. Section 3. Every person who shall refuse or neglect to take out license as provided by the above sections, shall be fined a sum not exceeding Ten dollars, \$10⁰⁰ and pay the costs of prosecution for each days violation and stand committed to the village jail until such fine and costs be paid

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in

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force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

The following ordinances were by motion introduced and given their first reading, viz:

Ordinance No. VII. To regulate travel on Main street of Traction Engines and vehicles loaded with offensive material etc. Be it ordained by the council of the Village of Amanda in Fairfield county, Ohio: Section, 1. That any one traversing Main street of said village between East street and West street, with a Traction Engine or with any vehicle loaded with Dead bodies of any animal or animals or with any other offensive material shall be fined not less than one dollar (\$1.00) nor more than five dollars \$5.00 for each offense and pay the costs of prosecution. Section, 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Ordinance No. VIII. To establish a Curfew. Be it ordained by the council of the Village of Amanda in Fairfield county Ohio: Section, 1. That it shall be a misdemeanor for any boy or girl under the age of fifteen years (15) unaccompanied by parent or guardian to be found upon the streets of said village in the evening after the hours hereinafter specified, viz: From April 1st to November 1st 7³⁰ p.m. From November 1st to April 1st 7⁰⁰ p.m. standard time. Section, 2. Any one violating the provisions of the above shall be fined for each and every offense one dollar \$1.00 and pay the costs of prosecution. Section, 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Ordinance No. VIII. To regulate travel of Bicycles etc on the sidewalks. Be it ordained by the council of the Village of Amanda in Fairfield county Ohio: Section, 1. That it shall be a misdemeanor to ride upon

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the sidewalks of said village upon any Bicycle, Tricycle, or any like carriage. Section, 2. Any one violating the provisions of the above shall be fined one dollar, (\$1.00) and pay the costs of prosecution for each and every offense.

Section, 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law

The minutes of the last session were read and approved as read.

The committee on Ordinances made a brief report and presented the following ordinance Ordinance No. To regulate the running at large of live stock within the corporate limits of the village. Be it ordained by the council of the Village of Amanda in Fairfield county Ohio:

Section, 1. That no horses, cows, sheep, hogs or other live stock be permitted to run at large within the corporate limits of said village.

Section, 2. That any and all stock so found at large shall be impounded by the street commissioner or marshal, and be released only upon payment of fifty cents (50¢) per head for each day so impounded and costs of keeping and advertising same. Otherwise to be sold at public auction as provided by Statute.

Section, 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law. and by motion the same was received and given the first reading. The committee on the Main street sidewalk improvement reported that they had talked (by phone) to John N. Wolfe, C. E. of Lancaster, O. and his charges were five dollars per day, and that possibly the work could be done in a day. A motion was then made that the council employ John N. Wolfe, C. E. to make survey etc of the said grade line roll call on the motion; C. N. Newton, aye; Francis Reichelderfer, aye; George A. Lutz, aye; W. A. Cromley, aye; Theodore Lape, aye; and Richard Warner, aye; The motion carried and the same

Crowley, aye; Theodore Lape, aye; and Richard Warner, aye; A motion was made That the trial lamp to be placed at the crossing of 1st street and Main street be placed at the intersection of the alley between Centre street and East street and Main street, after a thorough discussion of the motion a vote on the same resulted in a tie, the mayor casting the deciding vote in favor of the motion and the motion was declared carried, and the committee instructed to place the trial lamp accordingly.

By motion a committee of three, Francis Reichelderfer, C. H. Newton, and Richard Warner were appointed to confer with the County Commissioners on Friday June 19th in regard to care and necessary improvement etc. of Main street.

A motion ^{was made & carried} ~~was made and carried~~ authorizing the marshal to procure a post for, and to put up Curfew bell wherever he thought most convenient. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons who keep or aid or assist in keeping a place where intoxicating liquors are sold, furnished or given away as a beverage to have, allow or permit any graphophone, phonograph or other instrument of like nature to be used or operated in such room or place.

Section, 10. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to sell furnish or give away intoxicating liquors as a beverage except in a room fronting

The words "giving away" where they occur in this ordinance shall not apply to the giving away of intoxicating liquors by a person in his private dwelling, unless such private dwelling is a place of public resort. And nothing contained in any of the sections of this ordinance shall in any manner affect the right of any manufacturer of intoxicating liquors from the raw materials to sell, deliver, and furnish his product in wholesale quantities to bona fide retail liquor dealers trafficking in intoxicating liquors or in wholesale quantities to any party or parties residing outside of the limits of said municipality.
